# AFC CROYDON ATHLETIC 3-3 BARKING FC

Tuesday 14 January 2025 – London Senior Cup 3<sup>rd</sup> Round – Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking showed determination and resilience to overcome a 3-0 deficit against AFC Croydon tonight, forcing a 3-3 draw in injury time and eventually winning 6-5 on penalties to progress to the quarter finals of the London Senior Cup for the fourth year in a row.

In the only previous meeting between the two sides in October 2022, also ended in a Barking penalty shootout win.



The visitors had problems even before kicking off when Pat Ahern was injured in the warm-up, forcing William Oduwa to step in at the last minute. New signings Joseph

Johnson and Ugonna Emenike made their debuts, while Caleb Dennis was unavailable due to being cup-tied having played against us in the previous round.

Barking started brightly and matched the home side early on, with a corner in the fifth minute tipped over by Croydon keeper Amadou Tangara. Saweed Djinadou had a good chance moments later but fired wide and Barking gave as good as they got but repeatedly fell afoul of the offside flag in the final third. On 26 a Sam Edwards free kick is pushed away by Tangara but Juwon Akintunde is flagged offside trying to get to the rebound. Croydon took the lead in the 43rd minute when Dan Purdue made an excellent save but the ball was recycled to Kadell Daniel who pounced on a rebound to cut inside and place the ball past Purdue. Things worsened in first-half stoppage time when a break down the right resulted in Daniel doubling his tally, leaving Barking trailing 2-0 at the break.

Three halftime substitutions injected some energy into Barking's play, but an early setback in the 52nd minute when Barking were caught out by a long ball forward and Shay Brennan fired home for Croydon, making it 3-0. Barking struggled to create clear chances until the 74th minute when Akiljo Balliu found **Juwon Akintunde** in the box, and the striker coolly finished to give the visitors hope at 3-1.

Croydon nearly extended their lead in the 80th minute, but a golden chance went begging as the ball was somehow fired wide, a miss that eventually would prove costly. In the 82nd minute, Barking came close when a foul on Ellis Lawson gave Sam Edwards a free kick opportunity, but his effort rattled the crossbar. The visitors clawed another goal back in the 88th minute when Edwards' free kick was missed by Tangara, as the head of **Juwon Akintunde** got there first to make it 3-2.

With the clock ticking down, Barking's persistence paid off in the second minute of added time. Edwards delivered a pinpoint corner to the far post, where **Fahad Nyanja** at the far post nodded home to complete a dramatic comeback at 3-3 and send the tie to penalties.

Both teams displayed nerves of steel during the shootout, converting their first five penalties. Sam Edwards, Teddy Stacey, Fahad Nyanja, Sam Shaban, and Juwon Akintunde all scored for Barking, while Croydon matched them, albeit with Walter Figueira's effort going in off the post. In sudden death, Akiljo Balliu calmly slotted his penalty to make it 6-5 for Barking. The pressure then proved too much for Croydon's Mekhi Savage, who fired his spot kick wide, sealing Barking's place in the quarter finals.

We will now host Erith Town in the quarter finals on a date to be confirmed.

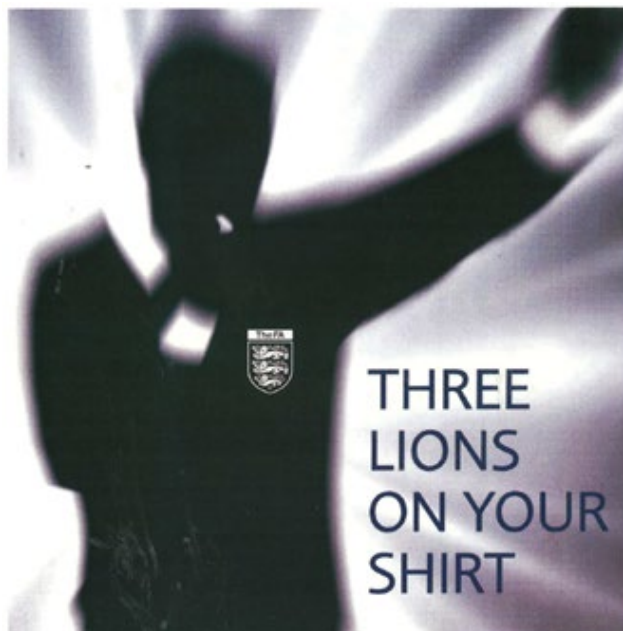

# ATHLETIC NEWHAM

The club was founded in 2015 as a youth team known as Lopes Tavares London FC before transitioning to adult football the following season and joining the Essex Alliance Football League.



After two seasons in the Premier Division, the club joined the newly formed Division One South, part of the Eastern Counties Football League, for the 2018/19 season.

In the 2020/21 season, the club was renamed from Lopes Tavares London FC to Athletic Newham FC. That same season, we were promoted to the Essex Senior Premier Division based on our performance in the abandoned 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons.

In the 2021/22 season, we finished in a respectable 8th position in the Essex Senior League, just 7 points outside the playoffs. The following season (2022/23) saw us narrowly miss the playoffs by a single point. The 2023/24 season was disappointing, as we finished in 11th place. The club has learned a lot from the last two seasons, and significant changes have been implemented for the 2024/25 season.

In the 2023/24 season the club faced some changes in team management, however, for the 2024/25 season, Athletic Newham FC enter the Essex Senior League under the leadership of Diogo Nobre and his assistant, Ricardo Freitas as well as the first team coaches Potchu Calucane and Clement Anselm.

# FRENFORD 1-3 BARKING

*Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> January – Essex Senior League – Report by Terry Gilbert*

On a bitterly cold evening, Barking showed their resilience to secure a 3-1 victory over Frenford, bouncing back from their weekend defeat.

With four new signings in the starting lineup and another on the bench, the refreshed squad delivered a much-needed win, with debutants Djinadou Saweed and Caleb Dennis both marking their first appearances with goals.

Barking started brightly, with Sherquan Touissant delivering a dangerous cross in the sixth minute that Frenford goalkeeper Kasey Clark did well to block with his body. However, despite Barking's early dominance, clear-cut chances were few and far between in the opening stages. The deadlock was broken in the 22nd minute when Akilijo Balliu latched onto a through ball from Teddy Stacey and squared it across the box to the waiting **Saweed Djinadou**, who calmly side-footed the ball home to open his account for Barking and put the visitors ahead.

Frenford looked to respond but found Barking goalkeeper Dan Purdue untroubled. Barking began to assert control, with Clark called into action multiple times. In the 33rd minute, Caleb Dennis was fouled just outside the box, and Billy Knott's resulting free kick was spectacularly turned away by Clark. As the first half wound down, Frenford started to press more, but Barking's defenders held firm, heading into halftime with a slender single goal lead.

Frenford emerged from the break picking up where they left off and it was no surprise that their pressure paid off in the 51st minute. A free kick from Nick Reynolds was flicked on by former Blue Warren Kayembe to Taymar Fleary, who fired home the equaliser, leaving Purdue with no chance. Barking responded well, nearly regaining the lead six minutes later when Saweed's flick freed Balliu, but his angled shot was wide. In the 69th minute, Barking's persistence paid off. Geneiro Maragh and Balliu combined to set up Touissant, who ended a run across the area culminating with a low shot that smacked the post. **Caleb Dennis** was quickest to react, looping a follow-up shot into the net to restore Barking's lead at 2-1.

The second goal visibly deflated Frenford and their attacking threat began to wane. Barking took full advantage and secured the points in the 80th minute. Balliu chased down another Stacey through ball into the box and was fouled by Reynolds, earning the Blues a penalty. **Fahad Nyanja** stepped up confidently and smashed the spot kick into the top right corner to make it 3-1.

With a two-goal cushion, Barking comfortably saw out the remaining minutes as Frenford struggled to mount any meaningful attacks. Victory lifting the Blues back into sixth place in the league.



# WHITE ENSIGN 2-0 BARKING FC

After last week's comeback success against Romford, it was a bridge too far for a further depleted Barking side who had no answer for the low block and quick counter attacking style of White Ensign, who were in complete control during their 2-0 victory at Burroughs Park. Goals from Jon Evans and Nathan Wilson were enough to take all three points for the home side.

It was a frosty day but credit to White Ensign's landlords Great Wakering Rovers who had done an excellent job for preparing their pitch for the biting frost experienced in the evenings and it was clear that there was no question about the status of the game. Barking had as many players available as unavailable, missing Miles Smith, Jay Bacon, Sam Edwards, Izzy Bademosi, Geneiro Maragh, Sam Shaban, Juwon Akintunde, Marcel McDonald among others for a variety of reasons including the usual injuries and suspension.

Barking were forced to turn to their near empty bench just minutes into the game as Jeremy Arthur was forced off with what seemed to be an ankle injury meaning the one returning player, Henry Mabassa from suspension, was pressed into action early. Barking had the first shot of note after 17 minutes as Teddy Stacey's effort from outside of the box was comfortably collected by Whitney in the White Ensign goal. Mabassa caused panic after 22 minutes as his poor header back was latched onto by an Ensign attacker but Dan Purdue capitalised on a poor touch by the striker to smother and collect the ball. Ensign were awarded their third penalty in two league games against Barking on the half hour mark, there could be no complaint for the Yellows as Mabassa bundled down his opponent in the box after being turned and chasing him into it. For the third time, Jon Evans put the ball down and slotted the ball past Purdue to give the home side the lead. Barking managed to finally put a spell of pressure together as the first half came to an end but this produced no chances.

With his hands almost tied, Craig Edwards changed the shape at half time, with Mabassa being pushed up front to support the lonely Tony Martin, with Fahad Nyanja switching to left back. It didn't help however and the home team had their second with ten minutes on the clock for the second half: an Ensign free kick on the edge of the box was curled towards the penalty spot and it was met by Nathan Wilson who managed to bundle the ball home.

Purdue did well to save a powerful effort at his near post after 66 minutes as Barking struggled to break the home side down. It was Ensign who looked more like scoring and nearly had a third after 80 minutes as Teddy Stacey was dispossessed with a strong tackle in the centre circle but the attacker slotted the ball wide of the target after being set through on goal. Barking did manage the first shot on target for the second half shortly after as a long throw fell to Charlie Thomson in the box, his powerful half volley stung the palms of Joe Whitney in the Ensign goal but he did well to pluck the ball out of the air.

That was it for the Yellows, who simply couldn't get going against a side much more used to playing with each other and took their chances while denying Barking any real efforts.

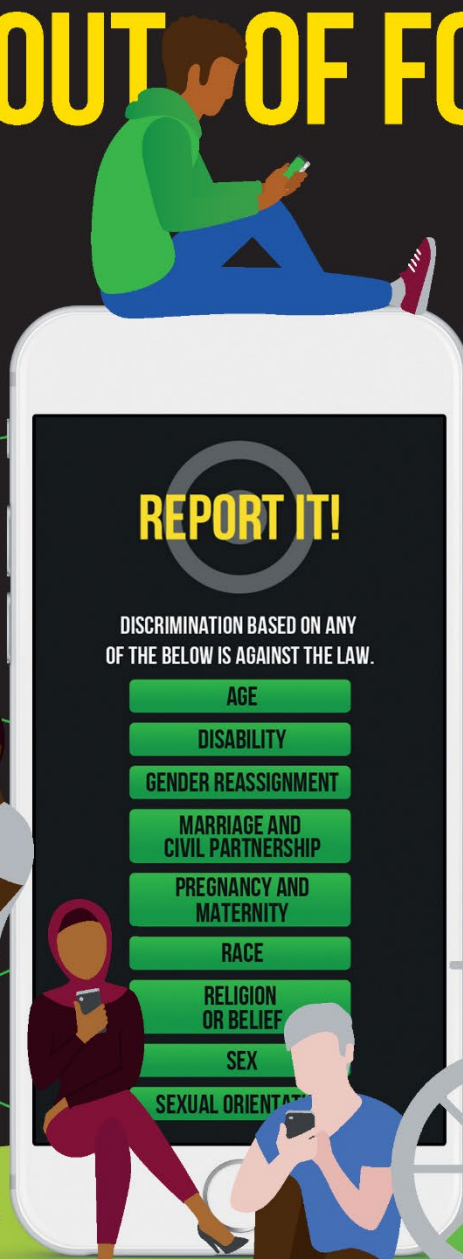
