BARKING 2-2 ILFORD

Essex Senior League – Tuesday 22 October 2024 -Essex Senior League – Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking extended their unbeaten league run to six games, but it was a hard-fought point in a match where Ilford seemed poised to take all three.

Struggling for fluency in attack, the home side had to rely on a 90th minute equaliser from the returning Tony Martin to salvage the 2-2 draw.

The game got off to a disastrous start for Barking when they conceded a goal just 50 seconds into the match. Michael Adu capitalised on a failed clearance from a free kick, volleying past



Max Spence to give Ilford the early lead. Barking tried to respond quickly, with Izzy Bademosi providing a cross for Troy Hewitt-Byrne, whose shot was saved by Ilford goalkeeper Wilkinson Boateng's legs after five minutes. Another chance came moments later when Juwon Akintunde's angled shot was cleared off the line by Nik Ahmadi. However, Barking struggled to maintain possession and allowed Ilford to control much of the game, frequently giving away set pieces and inviting pressure on their own goal. As halftime approached, Barking looked more likely to concede again rather than score an equaliser.

The second half began with Ilford continuing to look the more dangerous side, but Barking's persistence finally paid off in the 55th minute. Teddy Stacey sent Akintunde down the wing, and after his shot was saved by Boateng, Izzy Bademosi calmly slotted home the rebound for his fifth goal of the season, levelling the match at 1-1.

Ilford quickly responded with more pressure, and the well placed former Blue Greg Akpele, fired over the bar after a defensive clearance fell to him. The game entered a stop-start phase, with neither side able to create many clear chances until Ilford regained the lead in the 77th minute. Emmanuel Wazola fired past Spence after being set up by Akpele, putting Ilford 2-1 up. As the clock ticked towards full time, Barking seemed headed for defeat, but in the final minute of normal time, they found an equaliser. Miles Smith launched a long ball into the box, which was nodded down by Andy Greenslade to substitute **Tony Martin**. Martin marked his return to the club by volleying the ball spectacularly into the net to make it 2-2.

There was a moment of controversy in added time when Ilford had a strong shout for a penalty. Spence appeared to make contact with Joel Appiah, but the referee, Mr. Temu, waved play on. Reviewing the WDSportz stream the incident occurred outside the box but either way the referee was not interested in what appeared to be a foul. In the end, Barking will be relieved to have earned a point, though Ilford may feel they should have capitalised on their chances to claim all three.

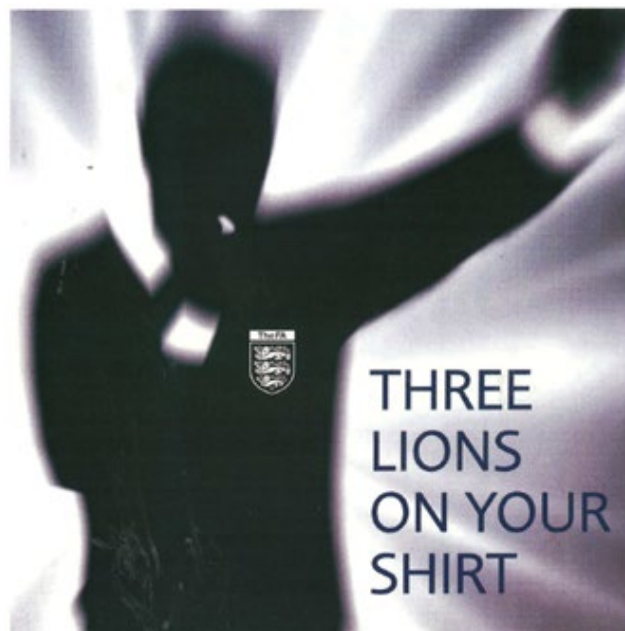

BUCKHURST HILL

Buckhurst Hill Football Club was formed in 1985 by Richard Brand and Alfie Sacre with the objective of providing youth football in the local community. From humble beginnings our first team was put together and Richard and Alfie were soon joined by Ray Sherrin (who is still our Club President today) to run the club, and with more local awareness more volunteers came forward to help run more teams.

Our first team success was our under 15's who were winners of the Echo League Cup A division in season 1985/86 with our first league success in 1986/87 with Richard Brand and our under 14' winning the Echo B division. Over the coming years and throughout the nineties further success was achieved through our youth teams from ages under 10-17. We introduced mini soccer and in the 1999/2000 season our under 7's won our first league trophy in the Barking mini league. Now thirty-seven years on the club has grown to over 40 teams starting from Under 7's to Under 16s, including six girl's teams, we also have our successful mini soccer training at four to six years of age. Our youth teams play in the Eastern Junior Alliance, Mid Herts Rural, Echo, Essex Girls and Brentwood Community League. We have now become one of the most successful youth clubs not only in Essex but throughout the country with numerous County and National Cup successes and league titles, and over 30 boys who have come through our system go on to play at professional level, and over 50 currently at academies throughout the Country. Our girls' section has also seen several players join professional clubs which is just fantastic. Our youth section is integral to our future to provide a pathway to our men's senior team alongside our ambitions to have a senior ladies team as well.

Season 2023/24 was one of our most successful at youth level with numerous leagues and county cup success across all our age groups which bodes well for the future. The club decided to branch out into Senior football in 2004 when it joined the Herts County League. The aim was to have a senior team for the youths to progress into and the club then joined the Essex Olympian League in 2008/09, moving up into the Premier Division in 2010/11. To help support our youth system we restructured our senior section in 2014 to provide a progressive path for our homegrown players with the addition of our under 18's, and under 23's to help develop them to men's football and our first team. A relegation was suffered in 2016/17 but the following season the club won the Division One title meaning a quick return to the Olympian's top division. That season also saw the Stags lift the Essex Premier Cup for the first time. The following season the club achieved a double as the Olympian League Premier Division was won along with a second Essex Premier Cup success. This was when the club decided to make the step up into Step 6 and saw the first phase of the ground development. This included turning the pitch around, concrete walkways, pitch barrier fencing, new dug outs, and new goals. This was achieved with 70% funding from the Football Foundation.

In 2021 we won the Olympian League Premier again and our promotion was confirmed to step six and for the first time in the Club's history Senior Men's football in the Thurlow Nunn League. The promotion into the Thurlow Nunn League saw the club also embark on the second phase of ground development with a 100-seat covered stand, floodlights, the Stags Kettle serving delicious hot food and the Buckhurst Hill Bar, the stand and floodlights was achieved with 70% funding from the Football Foundation.

BUCKHURST HILL

In what was a season of historic milestones, as the club embarked on its first season as a senior club and at the season's end finished runners-up and with-it promotion into the Essex Senior League. The FA Vase was also entered into for the first time in the club's history and the Stags had a wonderful run, starting off in the 1st Qualifying Round against Enfield, before going on to beat Newbury Forest, Great Yarmouth Town, and Gorleston before finally succumbing to Wroxham in the 3rd Round.

We now enter our third season at this level after finishing fourteenth last season our highest ever finish. We have also improved our facilities with a new 100 covered stand as well as tarmacked hard standing along one side of the ground where the stands are erected, plus two new turnstiles. Further improvements are planned over the coming years to align with our ambitions to move up the football pyramid. These are incredibly exciting times for Buckhurst Hill Football Club on and off the pitch and the warmth within the local community from everyone including all the Parish, District Councillor's, and Epping Forest District Council has made all the incredible work by all the Buckhurst Hill Family over many years worthwhile.

BARKING 0-1 BUCKHURST HILL

Tuesday 08 October 2024 – Essex Senior Cup 2nd Round – Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking's Essex Senior Cup journey came to an end as they were knocked out by Buckhurst Hill for the second year running, in a tightly match that was ultimately decided by a solitary goal. There were two first-time starters in Danny Taylor and Anthony Folkes, while Bradley Monks, started in goal for Buckhurst Hill.

The game began with Buckhurst Hill looking dangerous, with an early effort blocked after just four minutes. However, the match was frequently disrupted by fouls, slowing the tempo in the opening stages. Barking's best chance of the first half came in the 18th minute when a long throw-in from Steven Wade caused chaos in the box. The ball eventually found Juwon Akintunde, but his swivelling shot went wide. Just two minutes later, Akintunde had an even better opportunity, but his hard shot

flashed past the post. In the 22nd minute, Akintunde thought he had put Barking ahead, but the goal was disallowed due to an earlier foul by Sam Shaban. Buckhurst Hill also had their moments, with their best chance coming in the 31st minute when a well-worked passing move nearly set up a goal, but the final cross narrowly missed its intended target. Barking came close again just before halftime when Chris John's shot from a corner smacked the post.

The second half began under heavy rainfall, making conditions difficult for both teams. Barking's first chance after the break came on 49 minutes when a cross-field ball from Teddy Stacey freed Akintunde, whose cross was turned over the bar by Shaban.



A flurry of substitutions in the first fifteen minutes of the half seemed to disrupt the rhythm of the match, with neither team able to create any clear-cut chances. However, the deadlock was finally broken in the 70th minute by a substitute Buckhurst Hill's Khadean Campbell, who had only been on the pitch for six minutes. Campbell broke through the Barking defence and calmly slotted past Max Spence to make it 1-0. Barking fought back, with two close-range

efforts from Bradley McDonald and Stacey saved by Monks in the 78th minute. Unfortunately, Barking were dealt another blow when Ryan Cosson had to leave the pitch with an injury, reducing them to ten men for the final minutes. Despite their efforts, Barking couldn't find an equaliser and slipped out of the Essex Senior Cup.

BARKING FC 2-2 AFC CROYDON ATHLETIC

(BARKING WIN 3-2 ON PENALTIES)

Tuesday 25 October 2022 – London Senior Cup 1st Round – Report by Terry Gilbert

Probably the biggest drama of this game came late in the match with AFC Croydon Athletic levelling the scores in the 97th minute after Barking had held the lead for over 75 minutes. Enhancing the drama of the penalty shootout there were three saves made by debutant keeper Tyler Quinn as opposed to the two saves made by his opposite number Oshane Brown.

There were no less than six changes to the starting line up from Saturday's game at Southend Manor and there was also a late withdrawal as Jess Norey suffered an injury in the warmup.

The game started well for Barking and they went ahead after two minutes: after forcing two corners, the second taken by Georgie Fairhead was met by the head of **Harry Baker** and helped by a deflection finds the net.

Naturally Croydon came back into the game but Barking held firm at the back, but an error on 16 allowed an equaliser when the ball was easily surrendered in midfield and Nahum Green has the time and space to run forward and bury the ball past Tyler Quinn. The home side nearly regain the lead five minutes later another corner produces a spell of pressure, Alessandro Wisdom finds Alfie Leach clear but his thunderbolt shot smashes against the bar and comes out again. On 22 that is all forgotten as Baker plays in **Ronaldo Kapica** and he coolly side foots the ball past Rams keeper Oshane Brown to restore our lead.

On 33 Wisdom who had been playing a cat and mouse game with the offside flag was put through by Sam Dickens and this time was onside but he blasts over, five minutes later the same player has the ball in the net but guess what? He was offside. With half time approaching the visitors have half chance but their attacker directs the ball wide of the goal

Second half starts with lots of effort and running from both sides but no real end product and both keepers remain untroubled, as the half progresses Croydon are pushing on but no real cracks appear in their defence for Barking to take advantage of. The best chance of the half so far falls to Emiliano Lika but straight at Quinn, this is followed by a cross into our box which is fired over the bar – Wisdom has a chance for Barking but he cannot keep his header down. On 76 there is another chance for Croydon but this is fired outside of the goal and with the clock ticking sub Tim Ogunrinde has a chance five minutes from the end when put through but he too fires wide. It takes until the third minute of added time for our next chance when Ogunrinde, although stumbling finds fellow sub Luke Hirst who is crucially denied by the legs of Rams keeper Oshane Brown. Seven minutes into added time Croydon delivered the goal they had worked the whole of the second half for: from a break down the Barking left the ball is squared for a shot which Quinn parries straight to Lika who doesn't miss time and levels the scores at 2-2.

The tie now has to be decided on penalties and it is AFC Croydon who go first and Lika scores first for the Rams, Ahmed Abdulla forcefully levels the scores. Next comes the first of Quinn's saves as he denies Croydon's other scorer Nahum Green and Tim Ogunrinde puts Barking 2-1 up, Michael Redfearn converts for Croydon and Eljay Worrell is denied by Oshane Brown to tie the scores at 2-2. Tyrone Pink and Sam Dickens both have their spot kicks saved and then crucially Quinn saves from Michael Adipoju and thankfully Luke Hirst scores to make the winning score 3-2 and book a trip to Cockfosters in the second round.

REDBRIDGE 1-3 BARKING

Tuesday October 25 2016 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking took all 3 points from Oakside after suffering a second half scare as they fell behind before goals from Paul Oshin, John Bricknell and Omari Delgado kept up Barking's impressive winning streak. The win was the Blues' twelfth in a row and puts them 9 points clear at the top.

Barking nearly found an opening goal after 2 minutes as James Peagram found himself through on goal but he tried to round Mernagh in goal for Redbridge but he was able to stick a foot out and stop the ball going past him. 3 minutes later and Peagram was through again and this time was able to round Mernagh but being off balance as he shot meant the stopper had time to get back into position to make a good save. Redbridge's first chance came after 16 minutes from a dangerous free kick which was swung into the box with a resultant shot being blocked en route to goal by Ben Higgs. 5 minutes later and Redbridge had a better as the Yellows lost the ball in defence leaving a striker through on goal who took it wide to try and get an angle to put the ball past Michael Green but Green was out quickly and made a vital save before collecting the ball. Barking regained their foothold after the halfway mark of the first half as John Bricknell put Joe Pearman through on goal but again Mernagh stood tall to deny Pearman's shot with his feet. It took until the 43rd minute for another chance as Ricky Tarbard side footed the ball over the bar after some good football. Oshin also saw his shot go wide after a knock down from Peagram. The final chance also fell to Barking as a corner was cleared but Pearman swung the ball back into box where it found Higgs at the far post but his side footed attempt was palmed over the bar by Mernagh.

Barking started the second half on the front foot as they pressured Redbridge from kick off resulting in regaining the ball near the Redbridge penalty area – Joe Pearman worked his way into the box before being tripped from behind for a penalty. John Bricknell stepped up to take the penalty but saw his low effort too close to Mernagh who dived slightly to his left to make the save. Barking were not put off their natural game however and continued to control possession and finally got their reward after 64 minutes as a cross by Higgs originally evaded everyone before Pearman attempted a volley which was blocked but found the feet of Paul Oshin who shot hard into the right side of the net for the equaliser. Barking added a second two minutes later as Higgs from the right wing found Bricknell inside the box where he made some space before shooting low and hard across the goalkeeper into the bottom left corner of the net. From there Barking were secure with the ball and prevented Redbridge from getting near the Barking goal with Green simply needed to mop up any high balls.

The Yellows made sure of all 3 points and to put the disappointment of Saturday behind them as substitute Petrit Elbi – on his first appearance back from injury – won the ball in midfield and played Peagram through on goal with a powerful through ball and Peagram unselfishly squared to Omari Delgado who tapped into the empty net to secure the win. Barking will hope to make it a lucky 13 as they face Sawbridgeworth Town at Mayesbrook Park.
