STANWAY ROVERS 1-3 BARKING FC

Saturday 22 February 2025 – Essex Senior League – Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking bounced back in style from last week's frustrating defeat at Buckhurst Hill, to stun league leaders Stanway Rovers with a commanding 3-1 victory on the road. This result ended Stanway's unbeaten streak which started on July 30th against us.

Hassan Nalbant made a scoring return to the club, marking his first appearance since September 28th with a brace and an assist.



Barking had an early chance in the fifth minute when Nalbant dribbled through the home defence but lost possession at the crucial moment. However, it was the home side that struck first in the 12th minute. A long throw from former Blue Ricky Tarbard found Tom Maycock, who squared for Nathan Mardell to beat Callum Dennis to the ball and slot it past the returning Dan Purdue. Undeterred, Barking responded swiftly. In the 20th minute, Juwon Akintunde sent a ball forward to **Hassan Nalbant**, who powered through the Rovers backline and calmly slotted past Stanway keeper Callum Robinson to bring Barking level and in the process score his first Barking goal.

Stanway looked to reclaim control, with George Okoye's dangerous cross hitting the bar on its way over. However, Barking ended the half on a high. In the 41st minute, a throw-in from Fahad Nyanja was flicked on by Nalbant to **Sam Edwards**. His initial shot was inadvertently blocked by Sam Shaban, but the ball rebounded to him and he rifled it home to give Barking a 2-1 lead.

The second half began quietly, with neither side creating any clear chances. In the 54th minute, Nalbant was put through on goal, but Robinson denied him using his legs with a smart save. From the resulting throw Stanway countered quickly, only for Caleb Dennis to make a crucial last-ditch tackle inside the Barking box. A key moment arrived in the 64th minute when Stanway were awarded a penalty. Okoye stepped up, but Purdue continued his heroics this season, diving to turn the spot-kick onto the post – his fourth penalty save of the campaign, all coming away from home.

Stanway piled on the pressure with Barking standing firm, but Joe Turpin missed a golden opportunity deep into added time when he somehow put his close-range effort wide of the visiting goal. With seven minutes of stoppage time played, Barking delivered the knockout blow. **Hassan Nalbant** led a counterattack accompanied by Akintunde, Nalbant made a lung busting run into the box and despite slipping, managed to squeeze his shot over the line, making it 3-1 and three points for Barking.

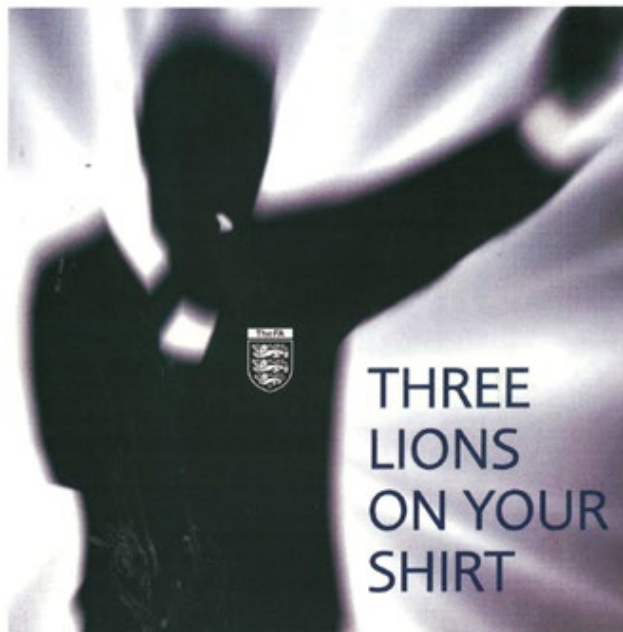

ERITH TOWN

Formed in 1956 as Woolwich Town, the Dockers attained senior status in 1995-96 upon reaching the London Spartan League Premier Division in 1995-96. By then the club had already changed their name to Erith Town, reflecting a move to Erith Stadium. After one year in the Spartan Premier, the Dockers successfully applied to cross the Pyramid to the Kent League.



After struggling in the lower reaches of the League for three seasons, the Dockers celebrated the new Millennium with a then best seventh place in 1999-2000 and reached the London Senior Cup Final, losing 5-1 to Bedfont. In the following seven seasons Erith only once reached such heights again, finishing seventh in 2003-4.

The appointment of former Fisher Athletic player Mark Tompkins as player-manager midway through 2006-7 saw an upturn in fortunes and the following season he led the team to fifth in the Kent League. He also brought the club their first silverware as a senior club as record appearance maker Alan Hanlon lifted the Kent League Cup after a 1-0 win over much-fancied Hythe Town in the Final at Folkestone.

Tommo's departure on the eve of 2008-9 led to the appointment of Steve O'Boyle who took the Dockers back to the Kent League Cup Final for a second season. Despite drawing 1-1 after extra time against Croydon, the Dockers went down 3-1 on penalties.

Tony Russell took over the reins when O'Boyle departed in October 2010 guiding the club to a third successive mid table finish but bringing the Kent Senior Trophy to the club after a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final.

Having achieved a new best of fourth the following season, Russell departed for neighbours VCD Athletic with Erith Town top of the League in November 2012 and after a brief spell with James Collins in charge, Tompkins returned to take the Dockers to new personal best of third spot.

Tommo repeated the feat in 2013-14 before departing and a turbulent 2014-15 saw three managers and a Houdini style escape from relegation under Martin and Joe Ford.

Two further seasons of struggle followed before Mark Deveney took over the club in the Summer of 2017, immediately appointing former owner Albert Putnam as President for his work as player, manager and Chairman in over 50 years with the club. On the 26th August the club took part in the last ever game at Brentford's Griffin Park ground, losing 6-3 to the Bees' B team in the London Senior Cup semi-final.

After a fourth-place finish in 2022-23, their best for ten years, the Dockers moved to share with Sporting Club Thamesmead at Bayliss Avenue as they bid to progress on and off the field. With this in mind the Dockers appointed Kay Deveney as their first female Chair in the Summer of 2023, with Mark Deveney continuing as CEO.

Under their stewardship the club has just experienced the most successful season in their history, finishing with two trophies – the SCEFL Challenge Cup and the Kent Senior Trophy – and winning the SCEFL Play-Off Final which sees The Dockers promoted to the Isthmian League South-East to play football at Step 4 for the first time.

We now look forward to the 2024/25 season with huge optimism.

AFC CROYDON ATHLETIC 3-3 BARKING FC

Tuesday 14 January 2025 – London Senior Cup 3rd Round – Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking showed determination and resilience to overcome a 3-0 deficit against AFC Croydon tonight, forcing a 3-3 draw in injury time and eventually winning 6-5 on penalties to progress to the quarter finals of the London Senior Cup for the fourth year in a row.

In the only previous meeting between the two sides in October 2022, also ended in a Barking penalty shootout win.

The visitors had problems even before kicking off when Pat Ahern was injured in the warm-up, forcing William



Oduwa to step in at the last minute. New signings Joseph Johnson and Ugonna Emenike made their debuts, while Caleb Dennis was unavailable due to being cup-tied having played against us in the previous round.

Barking started brightly and matched the home side early on, with a corner in the fifth minute tipped over by Croydon keeper Amadou Tangara. Saweed Djinadou had a good chance moments later but fired wide and Barking gave as good as they got but repeatedly fell afoul of the offside flag in the final third. On 26 a Sam Edwards free kick is pushed away by Tangara but Juwon Akintunde is flagged offside trying to get to the rebound. Croydon took the lead in the 43rd minute when Dan Purdue made an excellent save but the ball was recycled to Kadell Daniel who pounced on a rebound to cut inside and place the ball past Purdue. Things worsened in first-half stoppage time when a break down the right resulted in Daniel doubling his tally, leaving Barking trailing 2-0 at the break.

Three halftime substitutions injected some energy into Barking's play, but an early setback in the 52nd minute when Barking were caught out by a long ball forward and Shay Brennan fired home for Croydon, making it 3-0. Barking struggled to create clear chances until the 74th minute when Akiljo Balliu found **Juwon Akintunde** in the box, and the striker coolly finished to give the visitors hope at 3-1.

Croydon nearly extended their lead in the 80th minute, but a golden chance went begging as the ball was somehow fired wide, a miss that eventually would prove costly. In the 82nd minute, Barking came close when a foul on Ellis Lawson gave Sam Edwards a free kick opportunity, but his effort rattled the crossbar. The visitors clawed another goal back in the 88th minute when Edwards' free kick was missed by Tangara, as the head of **Juwon Akintunde** got there first to make it 3-2.

With the clock ticking down, Barking's persistence paid off in the second minute of added time. Edwards delivered a pinpoint corner to the far post, where **Fahad Nyanja** at the far post nodded home to complete a dramatic comeback at 3-3 and send the tie to penalties.

Both teams displayed nerves of steel during the shootout, converting their first five penalties. Sam Edwards, Teddy Stacey, Fahad Nyanja, Sam Shaban, and Juwon Akintunde all scored for Barking, while Croydon matched them, albeit with Walter Figueira's effort going in off the post. In sudden death, Akiljo Balliu calmly slotted his penalty to make it 6-5 for Barking. The pressure then proved too much for Croydon's Mekhi Savage, who fired his spot kick wide, sealing Barking's place in the quarter finals.

ERITH TOWN 1-2 BARKING FC

Tuesday 16 March 2022 – London Senior Cup Quarter-Final – Report by Terry Gilbert

This was a chance to forget the troubles of our league position for one evening and grab the opportunity to meet the B team of Brentford in the semi-final of the London Senior cup. Thankfully we did manage to achieve this despite the continual battling right to the final whistle of our opponents from the Southern Counties East league, another factor was the continual rain which did nobody any favours.

Both sides were quick out of the blocks and on four minutes we have our first chance as Kieran Jones has the right idea and shoots from distance: Erith keeper Jack Moore palms the ball away and is able to recover. Just a minute later Barking are ahead as Markos Tourakis sets **James Folkes** in and he manages to dribble through and finish past Moore. Erith have a couple of chances of their own, but they are unable to retaliate – however, on 17 minutes a poor clearance is seized upon by Steadman Callender who from distance fires over Finley Thackway and into the net for one all. Barking try to assert themselves and on 19 a shot from Tourakis is saved by the legs of keeper Moore. Thackway dives full length to save from Harry Gamble and then from a header from a cross is comfortably gathered in. After 32 the visitors have their first chance in a while when George Okoye does well down the wing and crosses to Jones whose header is gathered at the second attempt by Moore. That is the last chance of note, and half time brings the welcome chance to dry out a bit.

Barking switch things around at the start of the second period as Kyle Eam replaces Tom Salter: Eam goes to right back; Folkes moves to centre half and Flavio Jumo transfer to his more accustomed midfield role. The ball pings from end to end but there is not much doing in terms of goalmouth action or chances – around the hour the pattern has emerged with the home side doing the pushing, but the blue defensive line is holding firm. The first real chance of the half occurs on 64 when a long ball puts Joe Chalker in with only Thackway to beat, the Barking keeper doesn't quite do enough, and the Erith player recovers to fire wide of a gaping goal. The winner arrives on 68 when an Eam long throw is headed on by Folkes to **Kieran Jones** who slots home for 2-1.

The home side come again and on 76 have the ball in the Barking net but it is a clear offside and the strike is disallowed. The closing stages are Erith attacking and Barking defending and looking to catch their opponents on the counter. Even with three added minutes Barking retain their shape and composure and to manage out the game to clinch a spot in the semi-finals.

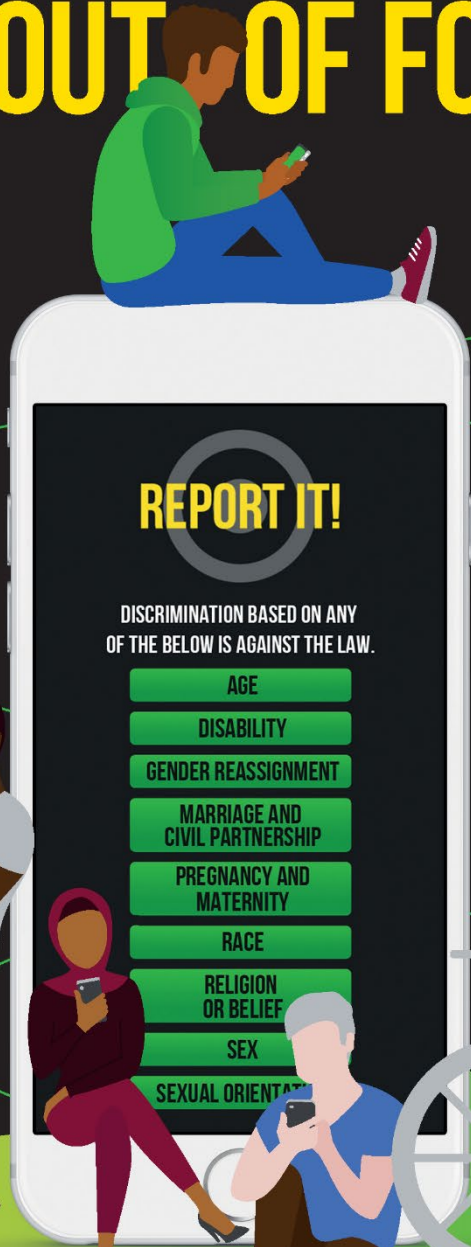
