REDBRIDGE 0-1 BARKING Saturday 17 August 2024 – FA Cup Preliminary Round – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking caused a Cupset as they snuck past Isthmian North and local rivals Redbridge in the FA Cup Preliminary Round. A first half goal from Juwon Akintunde was enough but Barking rode their luck a bit in the second half, including a missed Redbridge penalty.

Our only previous FA Cup meeting against the Motormen was in the same round on August 28th 2010 years ago, won 1-0 by Redbridge at our home ground.

As injuries still cause problems to our squad three players: Olu Shobowale, James Reynolds and Roman Michael-Percil made their Barking debuts, but Marcel McDonald was forced to leave the field with a shoulder injury.

Barking caused Redbridge plenty of problems early on, and the scene was set in the first minute as a Sam Edwards free kick evaded everyone and crept past the post. Barking should have had the lead after four minutes - Marcel McDonald threaded the ball through putting Izzy Bademosi in on goal but his attempt to beat Connor Wheatley at his near post rather than far didn't go to plan as Wheatley denied him with his foot. Wheatley denied Barking with his hands at the ten-minute mark – Miles Smith drove forward from the right back position and unleashed a piledriver that seemed to be finding the net before Wheatley's hand palmed the ball onto the crossbar. Redbridge themselves went close moments later - a cross to the far post from the right wing was headed towards goal but Max Spence did well to scoop the ball away from the target. Redbridge were denied again by Spence after 15 minutes – the ball was chipped over debutant defender Olu Shobowale with the striker finding his way to goal but his side footed effort was tipped around the post by Spence. Barking was not deterred and Juwon Akintunde stung Wheatley's palms with a powerful effort from the D of the box before McDonald saw his effort clear the bar at the 20minute mark. The game finally calmed down after this but the next chance saw Barking take the lead with half time closing in – Barking saw their free kick cleared but it fell to Smith who swung the ball back into the box where it was brought down by debutant substitute Roman Michael-Percil, he set the ball aside to **Juwon Akintunde** who had his back to goal but on the turn he shot low and hard past Wheatley and into the bottom corner of the net.

Akintunde went close again just before half time as a defender headed a free kick up in the air rather than out but Wheatley was this time equal to his headed effort.

Redbridge started the second half on the front foot with two substitutions and a change in shape, no doubt with some halftime truths stinging in their ears but it took until 57 minutes for the first chance of note as a shot went wide after the forward cut in from the right wing. Barking struggled to keep the ball while defending well and hearts were in mouths as Redbridge had their favourite method of scoring against Barking recently – a free kick from close range but this time Spence was equal to Jack Chawner's attempt that went back across him as he managed to turn the shot around the post. The best chance so far for Redbridge came with fifteen minutes remaining – a long throw found former Blue James Barlow in the box and he cut the ball back to the penalty spot but the ball skied over the bar. Redbridge kept up the pressure and it felt like deja vu with five minutes to go as the home side were awarded a penalty for handball against Barking from a long throw. Thankfully this time for Barking the outcome was different as the resulting penalty was skied over the bar.

There was still time for more drama – Redbridge did have the ball in the net moments later but the assistant referee had his flag up for offside. The decision stood after conversations between the referee and his assistant but the decision was too much for Redbridge's Wyan Reid who was sent off for dissent. With injuries and stoppages there was plenty of added time: Redbridge pushed forward and this left them open at the back with Barking going closest in the final moments as substitutes Nelly Martins and Michael Mignot combined with Martins shooting wide. It didn't matter in the end however as Barking held firm and progressed into Monday's draw for the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup.



TAKELEY 3-1 BARKING

Saturday 10 August 2024 - Essex Senior League - Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking fell to their first defeat of the season and only our second league defeat of 2024 at Station Road today, succumbing 3-1 to Takeley in a match marred by head injuries to Chris John and home keeper Jarvis Monk. In the end a lack of clinical finishing did make it all the harder for the yellow shirted Blues.

By not creating and taking enough chances they were beaten by a home



team who will suspect they may have scored more goals than the three times they did find the net.

Sam Dowridge returned to the club and went straight into the team and was the only change to the starting eleven from Tuesday night's FA Cup win over Tring Athletic, replacing Nelly Martins. The match started with both teams on the front foot, but it was the home side that had the better of the early exchanges. After seven minutes Sam Dowridge, nearly connected with a cross from Jay Bacon in the seventh minute, but he couldn't quite connect with his head and the chance went begging. Two minutes later, Sam Edwards had an opportunity from a free kick, but his effort sailed over the bar. Despite Chris John's solid presence in defence, Takeley broke the deadlock in the 21st minute when a well-worked move down Barking's left flank resulted in Bryn Thorpe tapping in from close range to give the home side the lead. Barking attempted to respond, Izzy Bademosi had a shot which was wide and there was not enough sustained threat in the final third to unsettle the home defence. Takeley continued to threaten, with Jamel Obeng on 26 missing a good chance after being given an advantage following a foul. Barking came close to equalising a minute later when Miles Smith delivered a dangerous ball into the box, Juwon Akintunde won possession, turned, and fired a shot towards goal, but it struck the wrong side of the post and bounced clear, allowing Takeley to escape unscathed. Ten minutes before halftime John and Takeley keeper Monk clashed going for a cross. After a twelve-minute delay for treatment both players were substituted and subsequently taken to the hospital. The loss of John proved to be a turning point, as our defence lost its earlier solidity. In the lengthy total of first half added time the home team had chances to take advantage of our defensive reshuffle and probably should have extended their lead: In the third minute Max Spence made a crucial save with his leas to deny Obeng and seven minutes later he had a stroke of luck when a poor clearance bounced off a Takeley player, onto the bar before going over.

The second half began with Spence again in action, within two minutes saving from Thorpe. Takeley wasted another opportunity and the game then became increasingly disjointed with numerous stoppages, fouls and some refereeing decisions that fell into the category of mysterious. Barking's persistence finally paid off in the 63rd minute when Akintunde flicked the ball on, replacement keeper Jack Bull hesitated, allowing Marcel McDonald to poke the ball past him into the net for the equaliser.

However, parity was short-lived as five minutes later, a Barking corner led to a counterattack by Takeley, with Obeng making amends for his earlier miss by slipping the ball past Spence to restore the home side's lead. Frustrations were compounded with fifteen minutes left when Akintunde was sin-binned for ten minutes after arguing with the referee about a foul that wasn't given. Upon his return, Barking struggled to create clear-cut chances, with Jay Bacon's effort being blocked, probably the one of note. In the first minute of added time, Barking's defence retreated under pressure, back to their own goal and without a telling tackle being made the ball finally breaks to substitute John Thomas who lashed the ball past Spence, who has no chance of stopping the third Takeley goal to cap off a very bad day at the office.

BARKING FC 1-0 TRING ATHLETIC

Tuesday 06 August - FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round Replay – Report by Terry Gilbert

In a tight FA Cup clash that always seemed destined to be decided by a single goal the longer the game progressed, saw Barking edge past Tring Athletic with an 80th minute strike to secure their spot in the preliminary round.

According to FA Cup Factfile on X, our last exit at the Extra Preliminary Round stage occurred ten years ago, away to Haverhill Borough with a 1-0 loss on August 16, 2014. The following season, we began our current decade-long run by defeating Felixstowe & Walton United 3-1 after a replay.

In the most recent FA Cup encounter in August 2009 at the same stage, Tring secured victory

with a single goal, winning by a 3-2 scoreline. However, this time, it was Barking who emerged triumphant by the same narrow margin.

With Andy Greenslade injured Nelly Martins made his first start, following up from his senior debut on Saturday.


Barking keeper Max Spence had a relatively quiet evening, making only one significant save, while Tring's Dan Gould was kept busy, thwarting us several times.

We started the match brightly, with two dangerous crosses from Izzy Bademosi in the opening minutes, however, by the ten-minute mark, Tring began to apply pressure, forcing Spence into a full stretch save, his only real test of the night. The first chance of note for a while came at the 23rd minute mark when a foul on Jerold Cobblah presented Sam Edwards with a free-kick opportunity, but unlike his wonder strike from Saturday his shot went straight to Gould. Barking's attacking efforts intensified, with Jay Bacon and Bademosi both having shots blocked, and when the ball ran to Edward's he fired over from just outside the box. Bademosi continued to be a thorn in Tring's side on the Barking left. In the 34th minute, Juwon Akintunde's flick-on put Bademosi through on goal, but his shot was turned behind by Gould for a corner. Moments later, Cobblah set up Bademosi again, only again for his shot to be blocked. On the stroke of half time Edward's free kick into the box lands at Marcel McDonald's feet: he swivels and shoots but the ball hits the post and bounces to safety with Gould rooted to the spot.

Three minutes into the second half Barking should have had a penalty when Cobblah was clearly shoved to the floor by Tring captain George Carbery and fell on the ball. The referee then blew his whistle and with the Barking supporters expecting him to point to the spot, he instead gave a handball against Cobblah. On 58 Akintunde twisted and turned on the goal line to deliver a cross cum shot, but unfortunately it went the wrong side of the bar. As the half progressed, it settled into a back-and-forth pattern, with both sides struggling to create any clear-cut chances. The possibility of extra time loomed large as the clock ticked down towards full time. The breakthrough finally came in the 80th minute when an sEdwards corner caused chaos in the box with the ball pinballing around the box, the result being Carbery inadvertently putting the ball into his own net for a scrappy but crucial goal.

It was nearly 2-0 two minutes later when Akintunde was denied by Gould. In the dying moments, Tring threw everything at Barking's defence but was unable to find a way past Spence. Unlike Saturday's game Tring could not force an equaliser during added time. After seven tense minutes of stoppage time, the final whistle blew, confirming a hard-fought victory and we now advance to face Redbridge at Oakside on August 17th in the preliminary round.
