HALSTEAD TOWN 2-5 BARKING FC

Saturday 12 October 2024 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking recorded a comfortable victory over Halstead Town by a 5-2 scoreline, but in reality they should have scored more, with two disallowed for offside and two efforts hitting the post alongside other misses. The actual goals from Juwon Akintunde, Andre Anderson and a first Barking hat trick for Sam Shaban. Barking had the lead in just four minutes, Jerrold Cobblah playing Juwon Akintunde down the right wing, and his low cross evaded everyone but **Sam Shaban** in the box, who drove the ball into the net.

Juwon nearly doubled the lead moments later as he managed to win the ball in the box but his powerful effort smacked against the goalkeeper Hayden West's near post. Shaban had the ball in the net again close to the ten-minute mark but this was brought back for offside. Barking again went close after 16 minutes – Sam Edwards' free kick was cleared but the ball came back into Sam Shaban – his low cross was palmed centrally where it fell to Akintunde but his shot while off balance was cleared off the line Halstead's Tom Graves. Barking kept going forward and it was Andre Anderson who latched onto a low cross by Akintunde after 23 minutes but West in the Halstead goal did well to get across the goal and make the save. Halstead finally had their first chance moments later as Max Spence was forced into tipping over a high effort from Dean Ager at his near post. Barking hit the post again after 28 minutes – a cleared free kick was crossed to the far post by Danny Taylor where it was met by Andre Anderson but this time he couldn't get his header across goal to find the net as it found the post and bounced away, Barking recycled the ball and had another chance but Shaban's snapshot was wide of the target. Barking finally got their second after 35 minutes – another low cross from Akintunde found Shaban with his back to goal who managed to find **Andre Anderson** in the box and he conjured enough space in the box to dispatch a shot into the bottom left corner of the net.

It got worse for Halstead shortly after as they went down to ten men temporarily after a sin bin for dissent by James Everleigh. This actually seemed to galvanise Halstead: five minutes before halftime they countered and a cross from the right wing was cut back for a shot which was off target but found Alfie Lambert at the far post for an easy tap-in to halve the deficit.

Barking restored their two-goal lead quickly after the second half resumed as after good work from Miles Smith, Shaban turned provider for Juwon Akintunde as the Yellows again broke the high Halstead line – **Juwon Akintunde** had the freedom to advance on goal – a defender managed to keep pace but his attempt at a block could only help Juwon's effort find the net.

Shaban and Anderson should have added to their tallies but it was Shaban who eventually got Barking's fourth and his second after 61 minutes as Barking pressured down the left wing before **Sam Shaban** turned in Jay Bacon's low cross from about a yard out.

Spence was forced into a good smothering save from 67 minutes from Alfie Cleal but Barking got their deserved fifth and a deserved hat trick for **Sam Shaban** after 81 minutes – a good dummy from Bradley McDonald gave Jay Bacon space in the left wing of the box, his powerful shot was saved by West but landed at the feet of Shaban who had an easy task of shooting into the net.

Halstead managed to get a second through Alfie Cleal who rifled the ball into the net, the effort was mildly controversial as Cleal had been offside in the buildup with the assistant referee putting his flag up, Cleal then let the ball go meaning he was adjudged to not be active. In reality it had no change on the game. There was still time for more action and controversy – firstly keeper West in the Halstead goal was sin-binned for dissent towards the other assistant referee, before Cleal himself saw a second yellow in injury time for a foul on Cobblah meaning they ended the game with nine men.

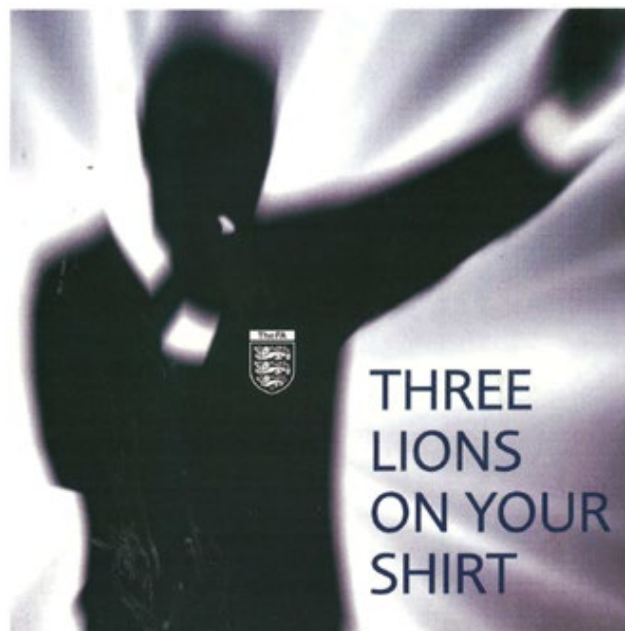

FC CLACTON

Following the demise of Clacton Town, FC Clacton was formed in June 2007. The Club was granted the FA Charter Standard Community Club Award in May 2012, the highest FA kitemark for Clubs.

The Club entered its first season playing in the Ridgeons League First Division with former Fulham and Colchester player John Reeves at the helm, assisted by David Coyle.

The 2008/09 season, with Coyle in sole charge, saw the start of a successful period for the Club. We progressed to the Fourth Round of the FA Vase (equalling the Club record of Clacton Town) and a seventh-place finish in the League gave optimism for the future.

The following season saw promotion back to the Premier Division, finishing runners up to Great Yarmouth Town. In the process we scored 117 League goals and won the First Division Knockout Cup, beating Halstead Town in the final at Hadleigh.



During the 2010 close season Coyle stepped down due to work commitments and was replaced by former Wivenhoe Town manager Steve Pitt. Pitt brought in his own players and there was a very different look to FC Clacton by the start of the season. Pitt's side finished 16th and Pitt left to take the reins at Stanway Rovers.

Former Colchester United Youth team player Andy Taylor was appointed manager and another upheaval of players saw us finish in 15th place in his first season. Taylor left early in the 2012/13 season and was replaced by Ray Turner. Turner's team struggled, winning just four games and, unsurprisingly, finished bottom of the table, only avoiding relegation due to an FA reprieve.

2013/14 saw the club thrust into the national TV spotlight when BT Sport adopted FC Clacton as their non-league team of the competition following us through to the 2nd qualifying round. Turner left the club in December 2013 and was replaced by Phil Yearling but he in turn only lasted four matches before he was dismissed. Glenn Eldridge was promoted from the U18s to take over as caretaker manager and he steered us to a 15th place finish and was rewarded by getting the job full time.

In October 2014 Eldridge was sacked following a run of poor results and David Coyle was brought back to the club. Sixteen points from the final seven games saw us comfortably avoid relegation. Coyle assembled arguably the strongest squad the club had seen for the 15/16 season and we secured our highest placed finish since the club was formed, eventually achieving a top half finish.

Coyle resigned at the end of the season and was replaced by Tom Gooder. However, this proved to be a disastrous appointment and he was sacked after a run of eight consecutive defeats at the start of the 16/17 season. Kieron Shelley was then appointed manager. We finished in a relegation position but were again reprieved following a restructuring of the Leagues.

FC CLACTON

In 2017/18 Tom Austin was appointed to replace Shelley. After securing safety when relegation seemed inevitable, he then guided us to a top six finish in 2018/19. The following season saw the club reach the Third Round Proper of the FA Vase, with a top half finish looking likely before the season was curtailed. Austin moved on in October 2020, and ex-Chelsea player Mark Nicholls was appointed manager. The season was again curtailed, and the club were moved laterally to the Essex Senior League in May. Nicholls himself stepped down from the role of Manager in October 2021 following a 2-1 win at Southend Manor, and David Collis was appointed as our new head coach. His time in charge lasted for just a month, with Austin returning to the club for a second spell in charge. After a strong finish, the club ended its first season in the Essex Senior League in seventh position.

The 2023/24 season saw the club enjoy its most successful campaign in nearly 50 years, securing a top four league finish and reaching the final of the Peter Butcher Memorial Trophy, narrowly losing out to Redbridge.

Hopes were high going into last season. Tom Austin stepped down as Manager in September, replaced by Ryan Salter. A new squad of players made good progress, before Salter opted to step down in February. Mick Hanna stepped up as caretaker manager to steer the ship through the remainder of a difficult campaign, with the club finishing in 17th place.

Hanna and club legend Sean Hillier form the management team leading a new group of Seasideers into the 2024/25 season.

FC CLACTON 0-3 BARKING FC

Saturday 27 July 2024 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking opened their 24/25 season how they ended their 23/24 season, with a 3-0 win over FC Clacton. The new look Barking side saw three debutant scorers as Juwon Akintunde (from the penalty spot), Marcel McDonald and Chris John led Barking to a comfortable victory.

The Yellows nearly had a dream start after 90 seconds as Juwon Akintunde flicked on a long ball from Max Spence for Marcel McDonald to latch onto, but his cross was just slightly too high for Izzy Bademosi who couldn't direct his header on target. Barking were comfortably the better side and went close to having the lead after 15 minutes as Akintunde nearly had an empty net to tap in from McDonald's cut back but an excellent last-ditch tackle from Clacton's Fletcher Hanna denied him, despite the referee awarding a goal kick! Barking had their deserved lead five minutes later: some good interplay between Jerold Cobblah, McDonald and Jay Bacon led to Bacon driving into the box where he was tripped from behind leaving Mr Miller with the simple decision to award a penalty. **Juwon Akintunde** stepped up and drove the ball into the bottom corner of the net for Barking's first of the day and Juwon's first in a Barking shirt. Barking doubled their lead ten minutes later, a corner from Jay Bacon was punched away but only to **Marcel McDonald** and his volleyed attempt twisted the goalkeeper around as it found the net.

The Barking high press continued to reap success and Cobblah went close just before half time as he drove forward after winning the ball back but his powerful shot from the edge of the box just whistled wide. Barking started the second half as the first finished and had their third shortly after the restart. A driven corner from Sam Edwards was met by a stooping **Chris John** who nodded home at the far post.

There were further chances before the hour mark as Cobblah saw his half volley from the edge of the box go over the bar and then Andy Greenslade saw his effort that threatened to creep in at the near post well saved. Barking took advantage of the lead to use their substitutes bench, including Teddy Bowden and Charlie Thomson, two of last year's Under 23's making their first team league debuts. Clacton also made their substitutes, and alongside drinks break on a hot afternoon, the game became more stilted with Barking still in the ascendancy but with less and less action in either area. Max Spence was bought into action for the first time as the clock ticked into injury time as a Clacton winger drove forward, cutting in and out before attempting to beat Spence at his near post but Max was well equal to it to keep his clean sheet and that was the last moment of note in an excellent start to the season for the Yellows.
