LITTLE OAKLEY 2-1 BARKING FC

Saturday 9 September - Essex Senior League - Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking were punished for not taking their chances on a sweltering day at Little Oakley as they were defeated 2-1 after taking a first half lead.

Lee Benson rang the changes and gave debuts to four new signings: Joe Clark, Yassier Nazor, Gael Kaliba and Ibrahim Kehinde.

Oakley had the first chance of the game after five minutes as a header in the box was wide of the target. Barking, playing in yellow, went up the other end and nearly had the lead moments later: Kenedi Dariri's cross low dangerous cross hit the bar after a deflection from an home defender and the rebound just didn't fall kindly for debutant Ibrahim Kehinde to put the ball home from close range and it was scrambled clear. Kehinde should have scored at the 15-minute mark as Martin Tuohy latched onto Fahad Nyanja's header and squared a bobbling ball to Kehinde, but the Oakley keeper Josh Fowler had just enough time to come out to smother a soft attempt. The game entered a lull until the 35th minute with another debutant being involved - Yassein Nazor collected Dariri's flick on, advanced into the box and cut inside before being tripped in the area for a penalty. Martin Tuohy stepped up to take the penalty and his low effort into the bottom left corner was powerful and accurate enough to beat the dive of Fowler in the Oakley goal to give Barking the lead. The Yellows couldn't hold the lead until half time however, as in first half stoppage time a right wing cross found Harry Mann unmarked at the far post and he half volleyed the ball into the net leaving Barking keeper Harry Girling with no chance and the teams entered halftime level.

The first chance of the second half fell to Little Oakley but this time Girling did well to palm away a powerful low effort and the ball was cleared. The game entered another lull until deja vu for the Yellows - Little Oakley missed a chance in the 74th minute and Barking immediately responded and again should have scored, another powerful Dariri cross was met at close range this time by Nazor but he somehow from close range side footed the volleyed effort back across the goalkeeper and wide. It became double deja vu after 83 minutes as a Little Oakley corner found Lewis Wood unmarked at the far post and he drove the ball home with his head to give the home side the lead. The game then entered farce, with a confused Girling sent off for dissent after a tackle in the Oakley half while protesting his innocence and Joe Clarke sent to the sin bin for his protestations. Fahad Nyanja took the gloves and essentially became rush goalie as Barking piled forward to try and grab an equaliser. There were chances for both Nazor and Tuohy in the extensive stoppage time but the goalkeeper Fowler was comfortably equal to both as Barking lost their third game in a row in all competitions.

GREAT WAKERING ROVERS

The club was formed in 1919 by soldiers demobbed after World War I and finding employment in the local brickfields. Not much in memory remains of the early years of the club although the club do pose some wonderful pictures from around that period. We first played in one of Southend's oldest leagues, the Southend & District League, where the Rovers stayed until 1982. Rovers were the league's most dominant clubs, especially in the 1960s and 1970s and to this day remain so on record. The switch in 1982 saw the club move to the newly formed Southend & District Alliance Football League, but sadly this league folded in 1989 leaving Rovers with a decision to move back to the Southend & District League or take a step up in standard. With what most Rovers feel to be the best squad amassed by a manager, in this case Eddie Nash, Rovers took the decision to step up to intermediate level and joined the Essex Intermediate League.

Rovers remained in the Essex Intermediate League for three seasons, winning the championships of Divisions Three and Two in successive seasons. After the latter, Rovers successfully applied to join the Essex Senior League and found themselves in Step 5 of the Non-League pyramid, which for a village club was a tremendous feat.

In the 1994-1995 season Rovers narrowly beat Sawbridgeworth Town FC for the Essex Senior League title. Rovers had collected 71 points for the season and lost just three times although the title win was only won on goal difference (18). During that season Rovers forward Paul Flack scored 28 goals, which included a haul of 4 goals away at Eton Manor as Rovers celebrated a 9-0 victory. Also included in his stunning season were two further hattricks. That season his strike partner Neil Ramsey grabbed 20 goals as Rovers hit home 82 goals.

Rovers defence of the Essex Senior crown would falter the following season, finishing 2nd behind Romford. In the 1996-1997 season Rovers would also finish second again, behind Ford United by just three points. The 1997-1998 season would be Rovers worst season in the Essex Senior League, finishing mid-table, 7th, and 36 points behind winners Concord Rangers. The club's final appearance in the Essex Senior League saw them finish 2nd behind Bowers United. However, due to Bowers United failing to meet ground grading requirements for promotion, Rovers were promoted to the Isthmian League in their place. With Isthmian League Division Three on the horizon for the 1999-2000 season, Rovers move into Step 4 of the league pyramid was complete.

At the very first attempt Rovers were promoted to Division Two finishing behind East Thurrock Utd by three points. Promotion to Division Two gave Rovers some stiffer opposition and the season finished with Rovers in mid-table. In 2002 the Isthmian League then reorganised and Rovers found themselves in a new look Division One North, finishing mid-table but more than holding their own in what was a very competitive league. In 2003 the club were embroiled in a relegation fight, although this was won convincingly as Rovers finished 15 points ahead of the relegation zone. A further league reorganisation in 2004 saw the club switch to the Southern Football League Eastern Division for two seasons.

The 2004-2005 season saw Rovers miss relegation by one point due to Erith & Belvedere FC being deducted three points, but in the 2005-2006 season Rovers bounced back to finish safely in mid-table. For the 2006-2007 season Rovers found themselves in familiar territory, switching back to the Isthmian League Division One North, where we finished 12th. Two further seasons saw Rovers finish 13th and stabilise themselves as a Ryman League club.

The 2009-2010 season brought a record number of points for the Rovers at Ryman League level, 64, but towards the end of the season manager Iain O'Connell was offered the management of Ryman Premier League side Margate leaving assistant Ryan Wilkinson and physio Cleve Taylor to take over temporary control with 12 games to go. In a season that saw Rovers top the table for 9 weeks, the dizzy heights would eventually get to O'Connell's side as they finished in 9th place, 13 points behind the playoffs.

GREAT WAKERING ROVERS

Ryan Wilkinson and Cleve Taylor would be implemented as joint managers for the 2010-2011 season and their first season in charge would offer up 44 points and 15th place in the league. Their start to the 2011-2012 season wasn't what they had hoped and after one win in their opening nine games, both offered their resignations. Rovers made first team coach Danny Heath caretaker manager and he brought temporary stabilisation back to the side as they recorded two wins and three draws from his seven games in charge.

Rovers would offer the management post to Danny Greaves, son of ex-Tottenham and England legend Jimmy Greaves. Danny saw that a clean sweep of the side was required and let go the majority of the squad, bringing in loanees whilst trying to sign up new players. Unfortunately, this plan didn't work and after a miserable run of six losses in a row, he too offered his resignation.

Rovers would offer ex-Captain and stalwart Dan Trenkel the position as manager in November 2011 in an effort to stabilise the club. However, Trenkel was playing for Redbridge FC at the time who were on a fantastic run in the FA Cup, and it would be two weeks before he would be unveiled at the club, Danny Heath taking temporary control again, although this time losing both games.

Trenkel would bring back a number of players previously released by Danny Greaves and opened his management career with a 2-2 draw at home to Waltham Forest, followed by a 1-1 draw at home to Harlow Town. However, although the side were performing better, results would continue to go against him and after just three wins in the remaining 21 games, including 6 draws, Rovers would find themselves bottom of the table and staring relegation into the Essex Senior League.

In 2014, they won the ESL by one point on the final day of the season and were promoted back to the Isthmian League. 2016/17 season was probably the most turbulent the club has ever experienced. Seeing two Chairman leaving their posts, together with two Managers also losing their jobs. In total 71 players were used in the fight against relegation without any success. As we were finally relegated after two seasons at step 4 in the FA Pyramid returning to the Essex Senior League. Manager Iain O'Connell, in his second spell with the club has been working hard during the summer to put together a strong squad and to lay down the foundation to mount a serious challenge for promotion to enable Great Wakering Rovers to get back to Step 4 in the FA pyramid the club expects, they went on to win the league at the first attempt, earning promotion back to the renamed North Division of the Isthmian League.

BARKING 1-3 SPORTING BENGAL

Monday 28 August 2023 - Essex Senior League - Report by Terry Gilbert

Barking's attempt to bounce back from their FA Vase exit at the hands of Potton United was met with disappointment, but instead suffered a third consecutive defeat, this time at the hands of Sporting Bengal United by a 3-1 score line and no doubt will feel they should have scored more goals.

Despite the score line Barking did find a couple of small positives amidst the gloom. Aundre Spencer's penalty converted with the final kick of the game provided scant consolation, while the debut of academy player Godwin Fuma as a substitute marked another positive, considering he has only recently turned 16.

The early moments of the match provided a glimpse of Sporting Bengal United's attacking threat. In the third minute an unmarked player managed to beat Barking's goalkeeper Harry Girling but was denied by the post with the rebound bouncing back to the grateful arms of the Barking custodian. Barking struggled to generate concrete chances early on and were left with only half-chances that failed to trouble the opposition. In the 15th minute, Bengal had an opportunity from a right-sided cross, but a well-timed double block thwarted their efforts. George Okoye responded for Barking with some skilful footwork to create space, but his resulting shot sailed over the crossbar. Barking's closest chance came in the 32nd minute when Chris Adu-Gyamfi's close-range header from Brad Rowland's cross was acrobatically saved by Bengal goalkeeper Sidi Haidara, followed by a clearance near the goal line. Just minutes before half-time, a costly mistake from Barking during their own corner led to a counterattack by Bengal and Steven Carvell capitalised on the chance and ran the length of the pitch to beat the exposed Girling and open the scoring. The visitors nearly doubled their lead in added time, but a crucial clearance by Aundre Spencer denied former Barking player Sheri Artmeladze's shot from finding the back of the net.

The second half offered little in terms of attacking action for either team. Barking's first opportunity came in the 52nd minute as a corner from Harvey Brown was headed over by Henry Mabassa. On the hour mark Barking crafted their best move of the half so far with Aundre Spencer delivering an excellent cross only for Adu-Gyamfi's header to go wide. Barking's struggles escalated in the 74th minute when Dan Okah was shown a straight red card for a challenge on Artmeladze. The ensuing free kick resulted in Carvell's low shot bypassing the wall and Girling to double Bengal's lead to 2-0 in the 75th minute. The disarray in Barking's defence was exploited by Artmeladze just a minute later as he added Bengal's third goal. Despite playing with ten men, Barking fought on but they struggled to make any impact on the scoreboard. Eight minutes from time Artmeladze came close to adding to his tally when he beat Girling to the ball, but his effort went wide with the goal gaping. Barking's late efforts were rewarded in the 99th minute when a fatigued challenge on David Owiredu in the box led to a penalty which was duly converted by Aundre Spencer for a very late consolation goal.

POTTON UNITED 3-0 BARKING FC

FA Vase First Qualifying Round - Saturday 26 August 2023 - Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking fell at the first hurdle of the FA Vase for the second consecutive year as they were comfortably beaten 3-0 by Potton United with all three goals coming from free kicks, two in the first half and one in the second half.

This was our first senior meeting against Potton since the home 4-0 win in the second qualifying round of the same competition on September 24th 2011. Our goals came that day from a hat trick by Chas Liddiard and one from Jake King.

The Yellows were behind after just two minutes as a central free kick smacked the post before falling at the feet of Shane Fox who gratefully side footed the ball home. Barking had their fair share of the ball but should have been 2-0 down after 14 minutes as the ball crept past the defensive line with the onrushing Victor Osobu poking past Girling but the ball bobbled past the post. Barking had their first shot on target five minutes later as David Owiredu saw his effort from outside of the box comfortably saved but they should have equalised after 22 minutes - debutant Jack Dickinson broke the offside trap from a Brad Rowland through ball, he attempted to round the goalkeeper before shooting but he took too long as the keeper did well to half block the shot before it was headed off the line by a defender. Tom Troubridge did well with some brave blocks to deny Potton a second, the resultant corner did see the ball in the net as a looping header was put into the net from very close range but the assistant referee flagged for offside. Another soft through ball found its way through the Barking defensive rearguard, this time Girling did well to smother the initial effort and then tip a looping effort from the rebound over the bar. Girling could do nothing just before half time: another soft free kick conceded, this time on the left wing and a floated cross being headed home at the far post by Richard Chadwick.

Barking would have wanted to try and get a foothold in the game but this was made even more difficult after eight minutes of the second half - a free kick in the centre circle was drilled out to the left wing, a low cross ensued and the initial effort was blocked by Troubridge but the ball fell to Lewis Lynn who rifled the ball into the bottom left corner of the net for Potton's third. The home side continued to push and Girling was called into action again with half an hour of the game to go as Troubridge lost possession 20 yards from his own box with the ball being picked up by Fox but his eventual shot was blocked by the Barking keeper. The visitors to their credit tried to push forward and Martin Tuohy should have scored his first for the Blues in his second spell with 20 minutes to go. Kenedi Dariri set Brad Rowland down the right wing, his low cross finding Tuohy six yards out but his effort hit the inside of the post and bounced into the grateful hands of the goalkeeper. Aundre Spencer should have opened his account moments later, this time he robbed the defender in the box after Dariri's low ball but his powerful effort only found the side netting. Missing these chances knocked the final stuffing out of the Yellows and even though they continued to look forward Potton were the team who looked more likely to score as they broke forward from overcommitting Barking attacks.
