GORLESTON 2-2 BARKING

Saturday 14 September 2024 – FA Cup Second Qualifying Round – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking, the last Essex Senior League team left in the competition put their name in the hat and threatened another FA Cupset but they were pegged back in the second half by a resurgent Gorleston as the sides drew 2-2. This was our third meeting with Gorleston and the last was in September 2017, which ended 4-0 to Barking in the first qualifying round of the FA Cup.

Miles Smith was suspended and his place was taken by James Reynolds, with Andy Greenslade injured and Hassan Nalbant and Sam Shaban both cup tied it meant a reshuffle. There were early chances for both sides and it probably should have been 1-1 after ten minutes – Zach Dronfield skied a close-range effort after five minutes and then Barking ripped Gorleston apart with some very good football and Marcel McDonald broke the offside trap and managed to round Gorleston keeper Travis Canham who managed to recover and block his effort on goal. It was joy for Marcel a minute later however, Gorleston failed to clear a cross by Izzy Bademosi and as the ball looped in the air **Marcel McDonald** launched himself headfirst and the resultant header beat the backpedalling Canham in goal and found the net.

Gorleston continued to threaten from free kicks conceded by a Barking side eager to win the ball back but they failed to test Spence. Barking's pressure paid off just after half hour mark: Juwon Akintunde pressured Canham as he received the ball – he simply couldn't cope and **Juwon Akintunde** was gifted the ball and after evading the despairing Canham he slotted the ball into an empty net for his sixth goal in eleven games this season.

There was little of note in the final fifteen minutes of the first half but whatever was said in the Gorleston dressing room at half time worked and they should have halved the deficit four minutes into the second half as a striker drove straight through the Barking defence but somehow conspired to side foot the ball straight at Max Spence. The pressure finally told after 53 minutes: Harley Black punished Barking for their foul count as he stepped up to a free kick and wrongfooted Spence, expecting a free kick over the wall rather than the effort that beat him on his right side to give Gorleston a route back into the game.

Substitute Jalen Johnson was given another chance for some FA Cup heroics but his low powerful effort at the halfway point of the second period was just wide of the target. Gorleston continued to push forward and put the squeeze on a Barking side struggling to get rid of the ball and keep it in the opposition half and the continual pressure eventually told after 79 minutes as Adam Tann headed home from a corner.

Gorleston were not done however and were not content to settle for a replay with five minutes of normal time remaining – again the Barking defence were pulled open and again Max Spence was the saviour as he palmed away a goal bound effort from Harrison Hall with the rebound from a tough angle going into the side netting. Barking also fancied ending the game today as Gorleston failed to clear a long kick from Spence as we entered injury time but Jerrold Cobblah's effort from just inside the box bobbed wide of the target.

There was still time for Barking hearts to firmly be in their mouths as Gorleston again threatened from a corner but an important hand from Spence denied the home side before the rebound was deflected over the bar. In the end, the referee's whistle confirmed a replay with both sides entering the third qualifying round of the FA Cup draw on Monday.

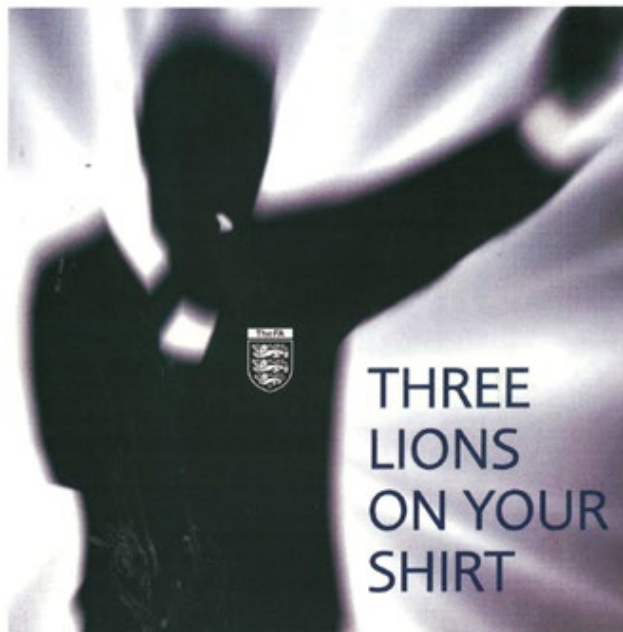

GORLESTON

Gorleston Football Club were always considered to have been formed in 1884, making them one of the oldest clubs in Norfolk. Initially they wore Crimson Shirts and Blue Shorts earning the nickname of the Cards. Their first competitive game was on 10/11/1888 when they played Beccles Caxton in the Suffolk Senior Cup, losing 1-0. In 1889 they moved to their spiritual home of the Recreation Ground playing their first game there on 09/11/1889 beating Yarmouth St Paul's 2-0. It was in 1903 Gorleston adopted new colours of light green shirts and white shorts.

The first trophy for The Greens came in the 1906/07 season when they won the Norfolk Junior Cup. The next season they became founder members of the Great Yarmouth Borough League and became champions in that first season. The club then immediately applied for membership of the Norfolk and Suffolk league, which was granted, thus gaining them senior status. In their first season they finished third.

The Greens progressed between the wars to become one of the most successful clubs in East Anglia, winning the Norfolk and Suffolk League title seven times, the first in 1921, and lifting the Norfolk Senior Cup on eight occasions, the first in 1922, when they beat Lynn Town 1-0 in the final. In 1925/26 they did the double of League Champions and Senior Cup winners.

Needing a new challenge, Gorleston became founder members of the Eastern Counties League in 1935. However, their only honour before the outbreak of the second world war was the Norfolk Senior Cup in 1938 when they beat Yarmouth 3-0 in the final. Following the war, it was the 1951/52 season when Gorleston gained national fame. They held third division Leyton Orient to a 2-2 draw in the first-round proper of the F.A. Cup. Several thousand fans turned up at the Recreation Ground to see the replay which was a goalless draw. The third and decisive game was a memorable cup-tie held at Arsenal's Highbury. At one stage Gorleston were 4-1 down but staged a remarkable comeback before eventually losing 5-4.

The following season the Greens completed a treble in what was their most successful season. They won their first Eastern Counties League championship and the Norfolk Senior Cup again. They completed the unique treble by winning the East Anglian Cup. They also finished runners-up in the League Cup. The League Cup was eventually won for the first and only time in 1956 when Spurs A were beaten 3-1 in the final. They again reached the F.A. Cup 1st round proper in 1957/58 season, but this time they were well beaten by Gillingham 10-1.

By the end of the fifties the club faced severe financial problems and were forced to withdraw from the Eastern Counties League back into the Norfolk and Suffolk league. In the mid-60's Gorleston became founder members of the Anglian Combination. They successfully rejoined the Eastern Counties League in 1969 after winning the Anglian Combination Premier Division title, along with the Norfolk Senior Cup, beating Downham 2-1 in the final.

In the ensuing 15 seasons the Greens won the Championship on 3 occasions in 1972/73, 1979/80 and 1980/81 and didn't finish lower than 8th. In 1982/83 they won the East Anglian Cup for the second time beating Bishop Stortford in the final. It was also this season when the club moved from their spiritual home on Gorleston Recca to Emerald Park. The new purpose-built stadium was built on part of the Magdalen Playing field on the outskirts of Gorleston.

The cost of the move to Emerald Park saw the Greens in financial difficulties once more and this had an effect on the field. League runners up in 1983 and Senior Cup winners a year later signalled the end of a winning period in the club's history. Following the move Gorleston were £150,000 in debt and it was only considerable good will from the bank and other creditors that kept the club afloat.

The next few seasons saw the Green's fortunes dip as they could no longer afford to pay for the top players and had to rely on local lads playing for fun. Subsequently, they were relegated to the first division in 1993/94. In the 1994/95 season the Greens missed promotion by two points and were finalists in the Norfolk Senior Cup. But they bounced back the next season to the Premier Division after winning the Jewson League Division one title.

GORLESTON

Creditable performances followed and culminated in runners up for season 2000/01 and winners of the Norfolk Senior Cup for the fourteenth time. Sadly, the end of the 2004-05 season saw Gorleston relegated again to the Ridgeons First. The following two seasons saw us struggle and finish in the lower reaches of division one. In the season 2008/09 saw the 125th anniversary of the club starting with a prestigious friendly against Norwich City.

Former Norwich City Vice-Chairman and our club president, Jimmy Jones, was awarded the MBE in the Queens 2009 Birthday Honours list. The 2009/10 season saw promotion missed by just one place, but the following season saw success winning the Division One KO. cup, the league cup and promotion back to the premiership.

2011/12 saw the team win the Norfolk Senior Cup. It was a sad season however as our club president and 'Mr. Gorleston', Jimmy Jones, died, therefore unable to see his beloved Greens lift the Senior Cup. New chairman, Mr. Alan Gordon took up the reigns.

2013/14 saw The Greens finish fourth and win the Norfolk Senior Cup for the 16th time. The Under 18's also brought silverware to Emerald Park, winning the East Division for the first time in the club's history and also reaching the Thurlow Nunn youth cup final. The club were saddened to lose a great friend, manager and coach, Glyn Hopkins, who passed away in November 2014.

In 2015/16 the priority for new manager, Ricci Butler, was to maintain premier league status. The Reserve team, managed by Scott Butler, re-joined the Anglian Combination League with great success, finishing champions and not losing on route. also winning the CS Morley Cup. 2016/17 saw the first team reach the 4th round proper of the FA Vase. The Reserves gained a second successive promotion and retained the CS Morley Cup.

The Reserves made it four titles in a row in 2018/19 and gained promotion to Anglian Combination Division 1, also adding the Norfolk Junior Cup to their impressive title tally. The Under 18's took the honours in the East Division.

After a poor start to the 2019/20 season manager Stewart Larter resigned and the Chairman was quick to appoint brothers Ricci & Scott Butler as joint 1st team managers. This proved to be a very challenging season for them both and also for us all as Covid struck near the end of the season declaring the season null and void. Sadly, in March 2020 Alan Gordon, chairman of Gorleston FC, passed away. He will be fondly remembered by the whole club, and we are so proud of his achievements whilst at the helm.

With Covid very much still disrupting fixtures, football took a back seat with only a handful of matches being played in 2020/21, but we did gain our 17th victory in the Norfolk Senior Cup Final. 2021/22 Football was back and what a season. The Chairman, Jamie Humphries, together with our joint managers, Ricci and Scott Butler, put a strong squad together and a commanding start to the season set out our intentions with 6 straight wins. A two-way tussle for the league title went down to the wire with Gorleston winning on the last day of the season to pip Wroxham to the Thurlow Nunn Premier Division Trophy by one point. Sadly, this was to be our last ever game at Emerald Park.

2022/23 saw The Greens play at Step 4 for the first time in the clubs history, in the Isthmian Football League North Division, in a ground share with Lowestoft Town FC. Manager Scott Butler was replaced by Darren Cockrill and assistant Ollie Willis who, after many challenges, secured the clubs league status and went on to win the Norfolk Senior Cup for the 18th time. The Reserves finished runners up in their league and were promoted to the Anglian Comb Premier Division and senior football.

Season 2023/24 saw Gorleston move to a new home at The Wellesley in Gt Yarmouth and a mid-table finish was achieved. The Reserves won the Anglian Comb Premier Division so were promoted into the Thurlow Nunn First Division.

BARKING 1-0 WEST ESSEX

Friday 6 September 2024 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking continued with the good times after their FA Cup success in midweek with an important three points in a 1-0 victory against West Essex in only our fourth league fixture of the season. Sam Edwards scored the vital goal with substitute Nelly Martins seeing red late on.

West Essex were keen to sit deep and punish Barking on the counter, the tactic nearly worked after nine minutes as Teddy Stacey lost the ball in the middle – the ball was spread out wide to Yemi Adelani and he drove into the box but his shot from a narrow angle was well saved by Max Spence. Spence was again called into action after 21 minutes as he palmed away a free kick that threatened to break the deadlock. It was deja vu for that situation but with the roles reversed after 30 minutes, Hassan Nalbant was fouled on the edge of the box and Sam Edwards stepped up and curled his effort around the wall and again it looked to be a goal before the outstretched hand of his namesake Lewis Edwards clawed the ball away from the goal. Nalbant went close just before half time as he latched on to a defence splitting lofted ball from Marcel McDonald but his side footed effort cleared the bar at the near post.

Barking threatened again right at the start of the second half. Andy Greenslade played Jay Bacon into the box and his lifted ball to the far post was met by Jerrold Cobblah who poked the ball towards goal but it was just too close to the feet of Edwards who managed to stop the ball from going past him. There was no time to stop however as West Essex pushed forward and they made an effort that went just wide of the post. Barking grew more comfortable into the game and were rewarded for a period of pressure with 21 minutes to go: Jay Bacon's corner was met at the near post by Stacey – his header down found **Sam Edwards** on the edge of the six-yard box and he managed to power the ball home on the stretch to give Barking the lead.

Nalbant then went close twice immediately after as he attempted to double the lead, first he saw his curled effort blocked over the bar before he headed wide from the subsequent corner. Barking constantly looked the team more likely to score and there was another chance after 85 minutes as substitute Juwon Akintunde passed the ball over the defence – Nalbant went through on goal but Lewis Edwards did well to come out quickly to smother the ball – the rebound fell to Marcel McDonald but his effort was too close to Edwards. For the second game in a row Barking received a late red card as this time substitute Nelly Mallek was sent off for his role in a foul he conceded and the ensuing handbags. It was still Barking who went closest in the final moments as Nalbant was through on goal and attempted to round Lewis Edwards but he was pushed wide and the goalkeeper managed to deny him with his feet just before the final whistle.

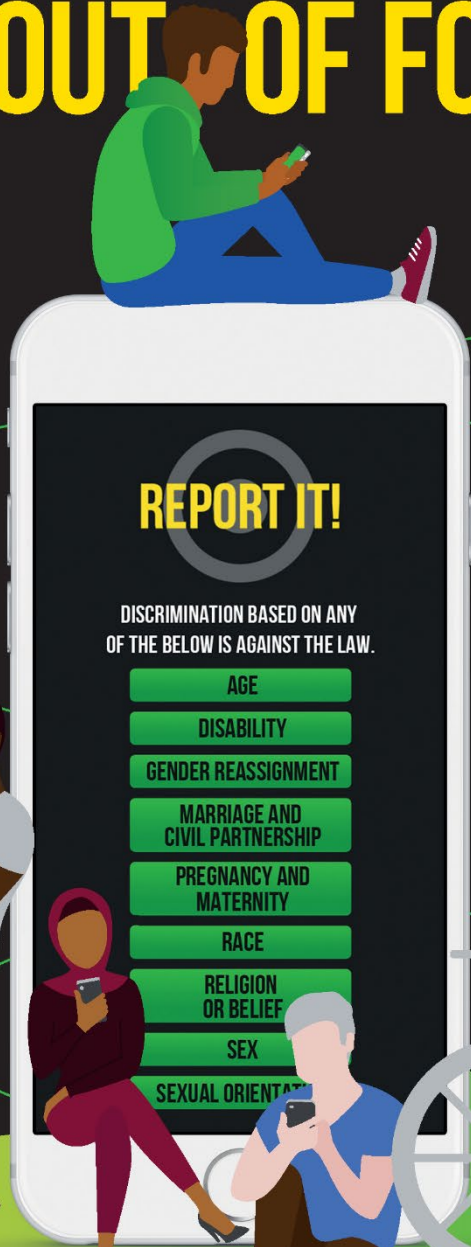
