#### **BARKING FC 3-4 FC CLACTON**

Peter Butcher Memorial Trophy 1<sup>st</sup> Round – Saturday 19 October 2024 – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking's rapid exit from cup competitions continued as Clacton fought back from 2-0 down to win 4-3 in the Peter Butcher Memorial Trophy. Barking scored early thanks to Izzy Bademosi and Juwon Akintunde but four unanswered goals before and after halftime secured Clacton's passage. Barking took an early lead after eight minutes as **Izzy Bademosi** headed in from Danny Taylor's cross.



The lead was doubled ten minutes later as **Juwon Akintunde** with his ninth of the season despatched a penalty into the roof of the net after Jerrold Cobblah was fouled in the box. Deivi Kreka went close with an effort similar to Bademosi but the game lacked tempo and Clacton took advantage in the final five minutes of the first half: firstly, Ben Sargeant finding the bottom left corner of the net from the edge of the box. Before the break Barking were again split open from their own attacking set piece with Luwa Luwabelwa being left in acres of space to slot home and mean the sides went into the break level at 2-2.

Clacton kept up their impetus and it was only thanks to Max Spence that they did not take the lead after 49 minutes when Barking lost the ball in their own half but Spence was powerless four minutes later as Luwabelwa broke the offside trap, ran the length of the Barking half untouched and side footed the ball around him. Teddy Stacey went close after 69 minutes after he drove forward and played the ball well with Jay Bacon but his curling effort was just wide of the goal. Clacton doubled their advantage shortly after as Remy Newell-Barnard drove past Stacey and again he had just Spence to beat as he slotted home. Barking threw everything forward to try and get their way back into it, Sam Shaban saw a free kick tipped over after 84 and when the resultant Bacon corner was scrambled into the air it was headed back by Kreka to **Sam Shaban** who nodded home from close range to make it six goals in nine games.

Barking's task was made harder as they ended up down to nine men with the clock ticking down, Bacon entering the sin bin and then substitute Jalen Johnson being stretchered off after a foul. There was still one final chance for Barking as the free kick resulting from the foul on Johnson was dropped under pressure by Clacton keeper Josh Fowler, but Shaban's drilled volley was blocked on its way to goal by two Clacton defenders attempting to make their way back to the line.



## **ILFORD FC**

Not only were Ilford one of the most famous names in amateur football for almost a

century, but from 1904 to 1977 they played at one of its most celebrated venues. As well as being on hand to witness Ilford's many successes, the 18,000 capacity Lynn Road ground at Newbury Park staged Olympic Games matches, Amateur Internationals, an FA Amateur Cup Final, plus countless other cup finals and representatives matches.

Formed in 1881, Ilford were founder members of both the Isthmian and Southern Leagues, the latter from which they resigned to be replaced by an emergent Tottenham Hotspur.



Ilford secured four-acres of initially undeveloped land at Lynn Road in 1904 and huge crowds by today's standards necessitated developments which transformed the site into one of the best stadiums in the country.

Over the next five decades Ilford FC was comfortably one of the amateur game's most successful clubs. Captain, Joe Dines, along with Ilford teammates William Martin and Leonard Dawe returned from the Stockholm Olympics with gold medals. Dines was duly signed by Liverpool... After winning consecutive championships in 1920/21 and 1921/22, the club embarked on its famed European tours, competing against FC Barcelona on four occasions (drawing twice) and beating Ajax 3-1, in Amsterdam. Back-to-back Amateur Cup triumphs confirmed this reputation. Four and even five-figure crowds were witnessed at Lynn Road during the period.

By 1951 nearly all the banking around the ground had been concreted, giving Newbury Park an 18,000 capacity with 1,400 seats, while in 1957 the covered accommodation was extended further still when a roof was erected over the terracing at the Ley Street end. But for the installation of floodlights in 1962, the ground remained unchanged for the remainder of its existence, even retaining its splendid white wicket fencing that spanned the four sides of the ground.

Further Wembley finals in 1958 and 1972 could not disguise the declining allure of the old amateur game. With increasing overheads, the old ground was put up for sale in 1977. Fans were seduced by the promise of a new, purpose-built stadium one mile away at Fairlop. This failed to materialise, following a tax bill which to this day is shrouded in mystery. A succession of ill-conceived mergers from which only today's Dagenham and Redbridge FC emerged the winner, tragically sealed Ilford's fate.... (but not quite)!

Supporters and officials of the old club managed to reform Ilford FC against all the odds, in 1987. After a protracted 8-year campaign with Redbridge Council, agreement was reached over the use of Cricklefield Stadium in the High Road (curiously a venue coveted by the club when doubts about their tenure at Lynn Road first emerged in the 1960s).

Successive developments have seen the pitch extended, the ground fully enclosed and £1m was raised to support the building of the clubhouse in 2002. As well as being a fine stadium, Cricklefield also provides a link to the old ground in the form of the Sir Herbert Dunnico Memorial Gates -presently awaiting restoration as part of a recent Heritage Lottery Grant, awarded to enable the club to extend its work in the local community

#### **BARKING 5-0 ILFORD**

Saturday 24 February 2024 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

It was a historic day for Barking as they levelled the clubs unbeaten league and cup run with a confident 5-0 victory over Ilford, a record that was first established back in season 1968/69.

It was 3-0 at half time, with two goals for Tony Martin and one for Luke Hirst. Man of the Match Jack Dickinson and Bleron Ademi rounded out an excellent day late in the second half.

From last weeks starting eleven Dan Purdue took over from Max Spence between the posts. Brad Rowland replaced Bleron Ademi and Jack Dickinson took over Sam Dowridge who was injured.

Martin should have had his first goal just a minute in, Luke Hirst capitalised on a scuffed clearance and cut the ball back to Martin in the box but he skied the shot. Tony
Martin made up for the miss after 12 minutes: debutant goalkeeper Dan Purdue launched the ball forward, it pinballed around the Ilford box but eventually fell to Luke Hirst through on goal, his low shot was saved well by Ilford keeper Wilkinson Boateng but the ball fell invitingly at the feet of Martin who had an easy tap-in.

Barking doubled their lead four minutes later as Hirst and Martin swapped roles – Martin cut the ball back to **Luke Hirst** from the right wing, the initial shot was blocked but it bounced nicely back to Hirst and his half volley whistled past Boateng at his near post and into the net.

Barking continued to pressure and ask questions of the Ilford defence and were rewarded with a third with 25 minutes on the clock, Brad Rowland blocked a clearance from Boateng and squared the ball across the box to **Tony Martin** who had another easy tapin to an open net for 3-0.

Barking was comfortable for the rest of the first half and into the second half. There were some half chances for George Forrest and Brad Rowland but it was Tony Martin who should have his hattrick with 30 minutes remaining: Jack Dickinson blocked a clearance, drove down the wing, cut into the box and beat two Ilford players on a mazy run before cutting back to Martin on the penalty spot but he lent back slightly as he opened his body up to side foot the ball and his effort cleared the bar. **Jack Dickinson** got himself on the scoresheet 14 minutes later however as Rowland floated a free kick from the right touchline to the far post where Dickinson rose highest and nodded past Boateng at his near post.

Substitutes Greg Akpele, Warren Kayembe and Bleron Ademi continued to cause problems for the Ilford defence: Warren saw his powerful effort palmed away before **Bleron Ademi** scored a wonderful long range shot after 87 minutes, Ademi run onto a pass from Kenedi Dariri and launched a thunderbolt which smacked the inside of the post as it found the net to round off a memorable day for the Blues.

#### SOUTHEND MANOR 0-4 BARKING FC

Saturday 22 October 2022 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking ran out comfortable 4-0 winners over struggling Southend Manor thanks to first half goals from Timothy Ogunrinde, Ahmed Abdulla and Luke Hirst. Alfie Leach capped a towering personal and team performance in the second half by adding a fourth. The Blues started stronger but were pegged back by a Southend Manor side that grew into the game but Barking took a deserved lead after 25 minutes as Ahmed Abdulla curled a tempting long ball over the defence which Tim



**Ogunrinde** latched onto before driving on goal and side footing the ball around Harry McKie in the Southend Manor goal.

It was Hirst's chance to be through on goal after 31 minutes but his effort was saved by McKie – there was a penalty appeal from the ensuing scramble but the ball fell to the edge of the box where a free kick was given for a foul on Abdulla. Eljay Worrell's free kick was blocked for a corner – **Ahmed Abdulla's** corner was low and driven at goal and after evading the Manor defender at the near post took a deflection and ended up in the net.

Manor had a route back into the game after 42 minutes after a soft penalty for a foul by Alfie Leach but the penalty from Manor's Kudus Oyenuga was even softer with Dev Bhamra diving the right way and saving it.

The home side were made to pay immediately after with an element of controversy – Ogunrinde latched onto a through ball with the flag going up from the assistant referee – the referee played on and with Southend Manor stopping it was an easy tap-in for **Luke Hirst.** There was some conversation between the two officials but the goal stood.

Southend Manor came out of the blocks fast in the second half, and it was only some heroic goalkeeping from Dev Bhamra that kept the score level as after an initial save with his feet he leapt back up to jump across goal and block the rebound. Barking made it four after 58 minutes as Abdulla's free kick from the right wing was nodded home by Alfie Leach.

Manor to their credit continued to push and went close after 66 minutes as an unmarked forward at the far post volleyed comfortably over the bar from inside the box. There were chances for substitutes Georgie Fairhead and Ayub Kadiri after 75 and 87 minutes respectively – Fairhead cutting in from the wing and seeing his effort palmed over the bar while Kadiri magically plucked the ball out of the air and advanced through on goal but his low effort from a narrow angle just slid wide of the post.
