POTTON UNITED 3-0 BARKING FC Saturday 26 August 2023 – FA Vase Preliminary Round – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking fell at the first hurdle of the FA Vase for the second consecutive year as they were comfortably beaten 3-0 by Potton United with all three goals coming from free kicks, two in the first half and one in the second half.

This was our first senior meeting against Potton since the home 4-0 win in the second qualifying round of the same competition on September 24th 2011. Our goals came that day from a hat trick by Chas Liddiard and one from Jake King.

The Yellows were behind after just two minutes as a central free kick smacked the post before falling at the feet of Shane Fox who gratefully side footed the ball home.

Barking had their fair share of the ball but should have been 2-0 down after 14 minutes as the ball crept past the defensive line with the onrushing Victor Osobu poking past Girling but the ball bobbled past the post. Barking had their first shot on target five minutes later as David Owiredu saw his effort from outside of the box comfortably saved but they should have equalised after 22 minutes - debutant Jack Dickinson broke the offside trap from a Brad Rowland through ball, he attempted to round the goalkeeper before shooting but he took too long as the keeper did well to half block the shot before it was headed off the line by a defender. Tom Troubridge did well with some brave blocks to deny Potton a second, the resultant corner did see the ball in the net as a looping header was put into the net from very close range but the assistant referee flagged for offside. Another soft through ball found its way through the Barking defensive rearguard, this time Girling did well to smother the initial effort and then tip a looping effort from the rebound over the bar. Girling could do nothing just before half time: another soft free kick conceded, this time on the left wing and a floated cross being headed home at the far post by Richard Chadwick.

Barking would have wanted to try and get a foothold in the game but this was made even more difficult after eight minutes of the second half - a free kick in the centre circle was drilled out to the left wing, a low cross ensued and the initial effort was blocked by Troubridge but the ball fell to Lewis Lynn who rifled the ball into the bottom left corner of the net for Potton's third. The home side continued to push and Girling was called into action again with half an hour of the game to go as Troubridge lost possession 20 yards from his own box with the ball being picked up by Fox but his eventual shot was blocked by the Barking keeper. The visitors to their credit tried to push forward and Martin Tuohy should have scored his first for the Blues in his second spell with 20 minutes to go. Kenedi Dariri set Brad Rowland down the right wing, his low cross finding Tuohy six yards out but his effort hit the inside of the post and bounced into the grateful hands of the goalkeeper. Aundre Spencer should have opened his account moments later, this time he robbed the defender in the box after Dariri's low ball but his powerful effort only found the side netting. Missing these chances knocked the final stuffing out of the Yellows and even though they continued to look forward Potton were the team who looked more likely to score as they broke forward from overcommitting Barking attacks.



HEYBRIDGE SWIFTS 2-0 BARKING FC

Saturday 19 August 2023 – FA Cup Preliminary Round – Report by Keith Whittington

Barking's participation in this season's FA Cup sadly came to an end at the home of their higher ranked opponents, although the final scoreline perhaps flattered a Heybridge side featuring former blues Kieran Jones and Kane Munday.

After the usual cagey opening, Heybridge forced two corners in guick succession within the first ten minutes leading to goal bound headers, but Harry Girling was well positioned to save both. Barking's first chance came after fifteen minutes, Kai Haysman's weak shot failing to trouble home keeper Callum Chafer, but the opening goal came after twenty minutes, as following what seemed to be a fair challenge by Dan Okah, the resulting free kick was curled over the defensive wall by Heybridge's Sam Park and into the net via the underside of the cross bar. Barking responded with a free kick of their own after twentyfive minutes, Samraj Gill's delivery evading everyone before running out of play, and three minutes later, a further free kick from Aundre Spencer was only partially cleared by the home defence, and when the ball was delivered back in, Kenedi Dariri narrowly failed to divert it beyond Chafer as his well-timed run evaded the offside trap. On thirty-three minutes Martin Tuohy then latched onto a through ball but was injured in a collision with the guickly advancing Chafer, resulting in his withdrawal four minutes later, being replaced by Chris Adu Gyamfi. Barking continued to press, but on forty-two minutes, after a Barking free kick near the home goal line had been blocked, the resulting clearance allowed Rob Harvey to outpace the covering defenders and slot the ball past the advancing Girling into the far corner.

A fired-up Barking started the second half much the livelier, and almost pulled a goal back within the first few minutes with Haysman's corner being headed wide by Henry Mabassa, Adu Gyamfi having a shot well saved by Chafer, and George Okoye forcing another corner from a covering defender. However, possibly our best chance came on fifty-two minutes, as another Gill corner was headed back across the penalty area by Dariri, only for Okoye to fail to make clean contact with the ball and his header flew wide. Barking continued to press and Dariri's well directed cross was well claimed under pressure by Chafer before the home side finally produced a chance of their own, Park's shot being blocked by the defence. With Adu Gyamfi beginning to create some uncertainty in the home defence, Barking did finally get the ball in the Heybridge net on fifty-seven minutes, but Okoye was adjudged to have fouled a defender as he managed to turn in Hayman's cross. With Brad Rowland replacing Gill, Barking continued to press and Fahad Nyanja's pass to the overlapping Aundre Spencer was just over hit, before a marauding run from Rowland created another crossing opportunity for Haysman, but his delivery was easily dealt with by the home defence. On seventy-two minutes, Okoye and Dariri played a good one-two with Heybridge finally able to clear the ball for another Barking corner, and the Blues made their final change on 73 minutes, with David Owiredu replacing Haysman. and he almost made an immediate impact, cutting in between two covering defenders out wide, but his final cross was behind two onrushing attackers. Dariri then found himself in space some twenty-five yards out, but he couldn't keep his shot down, but on seventy-eight minutes, Barking's plans were disrupted with Mabassa having his ankle trodden on as he fell following a corner, and although he did return after lengthy treatment, the Blues were forced to play with ten men as the minutes ticked by, having used all their substitutes. With the Blues unable to create any more chances following this, Heybridge were able to manage the game without further alarm.

SPORTING BENGAL

NG BENGAL

It all began with a football tour to Bangladesh in 1996 by a group of the best Bangladeshi players in London. There was a realisation that talent was being wasted with the divisions that existed and a solution was required to tackle these divisions.

Sporting Bengal United FC was therefore established in 1996 to challenge the under-representation of Asians in football and to offer Bangladeshi and other young Asian people a chance to play football at a higher level.

In eight years the team rose from amateur Sunday league football to semi-professional football. Today, the club offers

local young people of all backgrounds the opportunity to play semi-professional football. It broke down many barriers and was one of the first Asian teams to play in the famous FA Cup competition.

Sporting Bengal is well known within the footballing community, including the Football Association, Professional Footballers Association, Kick It Out and other football bodies. It is famous and well known within the Bangladeshi/Asian community in the UK and in Bangladesh. It takes part in national tournaments including the annual UK Asian Championships in Glasgow, Scotland.

Sporting Bengal has grown over the years and now runs a Football Academy for youth and a Legends team for veterans. The team has made history recently in the FA Cup by progressing to the First Qualifying Round for the first time in the club's history

ROMFORD 2-2 BARKING FC

Wednesday 15 August 2023 – Essex Senior League - Report by Terry Gilbert

The Double O's of Barking: George Okoye and Dan Okah scored both goals as Barking rescued a point in another encounter with our old rivals Romford, the match didn't fail to deliver in excitement as both teams battled to a dramatic draw. The second half stretched on and on for 60 minutes, testing the patience of players and supporters alike from both sides.

Barking coming off the back of Saturday's 4-2 win over Stanway Rovers, made just one change to their lineup from the previous match, with Aundre Spencer stepping in for Ciaran Burke.

The opening minutes of the game saw little action, but Romford quickly made their presence known with a strong penalty appeal when Kenedi Dariri tangled with a Romford attacker. Despite the protests, the referee remained unmoved. The deadlock was broken in the 7th minute when Aundre Spencer's corner caused confusion in Romford's defence. Scott Doe and goalkeeper Jake Anderson both went for the ball, but it fell to Martin Tuohy whose shot was blocked. **George Okoye** was quick to react, slotting the ball home and giving Barking the lead.

Eight minutes later Tuohy delivered an excellent cross narrowly missing the lurking Okoye. Romford, determined to level the score, showed their intent with a fierce shot in the 17th minute, but Barking's keeper Girling managed to deflect the effort away and Bruno Gomes fired the rebound wide as the first half progressed, both teams had their moments, with Fahad Nynja backheeling the ball to Spencer, whose cross narrowly missed Tuohy's head. On the half hour tempers flared as Henry Mabassa pulled down Sam Deering just outside the box and the Barking defender was lucky to see only a yellow card . The resulting free kick taken by Deering ended up wide of the goal. Five minutes from the break Barking are caught up field and Charlie Morris of Romford is allowed to get away and deliver a dangerous cross but thankfully this is cleared by the covering Kenedi Dariri who then gets up to the other end and fires in a shot which bounces off the body of keeper Anderson, with Tuohy's follow-up effort flagged offside. In the second minute of added time Isioma Richard and Tuohy do a lovely one two and the former crosses to Brad Rowland but he fires wide. Barking goes into the break a goal up, but there is more to come

Gomes of Romford has the first shot of the second half thinking Girling is off his line but Barking's keeper gathers the ball at the second attempt and on 49 Romford came close once again, as a menacing cross reached Deering and his header rattled the crossbar before sailing over the goal. Romford equalised on 62 but it was not without controversy as the ball went out for a throw in that was clearly Barking's, the Assistant was overruled by the referee and the Barking's defence switched off, allowing the cross to come in to give Gomes a straightforward chance to equalise. A couple of minutes after this Brad Rowland was sinbinned for ten minutes and Barking found they were down to ten men and nearing the end of Rowland's 'sentence: a goal down. Deering found the time and space to curl a precision shot into the net, giving Romford a 2-1 lead in the 73rd minute. The goal aside, Barking did manage to handle the loss of Rowland and refused to buckle under some heavy pressure. The turning point came in the 81st minute when a free kick from Spencer resulted in a goalmouth scramble and **Dan Okah** managed to nod the ball over the line despite Anderson's desperate attempt to save it and put Barking back at 2-2.

In the dying minutes of the match, Tuohy showcased his creativity with a flick that set up sub-Gabriel Oloko for a promising opportunity, but the lack of support denied them a late winner. However, the dramatics continued as Oloko's frustration boiled over, resulting in a red card after a clash with Romford's Darren Phillps leaving Barking to hold out the remaining minutes once again with ten men

BARKING 4-2 STANWAY ROVERS Saturday 12 August 2023 – Essex Senior League – Report by Terry Gilbert

After Tuesday's defeat against Tilbury and two consecutive goalless league games the Blues got going again with a 4-2 victory over Stanway Rovers. Ciaran Burke and George Okoye made their first starts of the season as did Dan Okah wearing a Barking shirt for the first time since April 2013 – Ricky Tarbard wore the number two shirt for Stanway as he did in over 200 appearances for Barking.

The opening minutes saw Barking setting the tempo with their play and just four minutes into the game, a well-executed pass from Brad Rowland found **Isioma Richard** in a prime position. Displaying good composure, Richard calmly slotted the ball past Stanway goalkeeper Alfie Margilani for the first goal.

As the clock ticked on, both teams looked to score: Ciaran Burke's efforts nearly came to fruition in the eighth minute when his precise cross narrowly eluded Martin Tuohy's waiting boot. Stanway nearly seized their first opportunity in the 13th minute, capitalising on a momentary lapse in Barking's defence. However, home keeper Harry Girling's guick reflexes and legs prevented any damage to the scoreline. The action continued with Stanway coming more into the game and in the 20th minute, a poor throw-in from Barking provided Stanway with a chance, but thankfully the resulting shot found the side netting. Stanway's persistence paid off and in the 22nd minute a defensive blunder handed Kieran Southgate a simple opportunity to equalise which he took. The latter stages of the first half witnessed a period of Barking dominance. Stanway's goalkeeper, Alfie Margilani, was called upon to make crucial saves, denying Okoye and Richard. Meanwhile, Andrew Fennell of Stanway tried to exploit the flanks but was thwarted by his own profligacy, firing over on two separate occasions. The momentum pendulum swung back in Barking's favour after the half-hour mark. Brad Rowland orchestrated a sequence of passes, culminating in Tuohy feeding Kenedi Dariri who curled the ball into the net, ending the move in a spectacular fashion and restoring Barking's lead. With six minutes to half time Fennell leaves Burke on the deck before firing wide and he probably should've done better. There are no further dramas and Barking go into half time a goal up...

Just after the restart Stanway found themselves level at 2-2, a defensive lapse down the right flank paved the way for Fennell to equalise for a second time, tapping the ball into an unguarded net. As the game progressed, an unfortunate trend of fouls emerged hampering the flow of the match, nevertheless the game did get going again and it was Barking who wrested the initiative from the visitors. But first in the 63rd minute, Stanway nearly capitalised on another defensive slip-up, only for Fennell's inexplicably to pass the ball back to the waiting arms of the grateful Girling with the goal gaping. Barking retook the lead from a set piece on 68, as George Okoye's corner found the towering **Henry Mabassa**, who thundered a header into the net to make it 3-2.

The game's climax arrived in the 75th minute, with Richard intercepting the ball and finding **Fahad Nyanja** who seized the opportunity, skilfully evading a defender before expertly guiding the ball past Margilani and slotting the ball home to stretch the lead to 4-2. From that point onward Barking exhibited solid defending to protect their advantage, limiting Stanway to scraps as the resolute backline held firm securing both a welcome victory and three valuable points in an encounter that moved from side to side before settling on the Blues
