ATHLETIC NEWHAM 3-4 BARKING FC

Saturday 29 March 2025 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking got back to winning ways after a disappointing defeat last Friday evening but Athletic Newham made them work very hard as the Blues eventually ran out 4-3 victors, with Caleb Dennis, Sam Shaban, Sam Edwards and Teddy Stacey on the scoresheet.

It was a blustery day in Dagenham which had an effect on the play, with Barking going closest in the first fifteen minutes from a series of set pieces from Edwards. Barking finally half-tested Harold Adu-Poku in the Newham goal after 20 minutes as a Sam Edwards cross was met by Sam Shaban but it was gathered eventually by the Newham stopper. It was Newham who took the lead after 29 minutes – a counterattack worked the ball to the ever-dangerous Anderson Baro, who is even more dangerous when left in space and he drove forward and shot low and hard across Dan Purdue into the net with the help of the post. Barking levelled the game nearly immediately, Akiljo Balliu's cross found its way to **Caleb Dennis** at the far post and his acrobatic volley slammed the ball into the net for his third of the season.



Barking started the second half as they finished the first and had a deserved lead five minutes in, Charlie Thomson's pass was dummied by Sibanda and found Juwon Akintunde in space – he shot low across Adu-Poku who couldn't hold the ball and **Sam Shaban** stayed alive to capitalise for his 18th league goal of the season.

It was déjà vu however for everyone in attendance, as this time Newham equalised two minutes later, with the defence split by a through ball Leonardo Pedro rounded the onrushing Purdue and slotted into the empty net for 2-2. Barking had the lead back however after 59 minutes, an attack down the left wing from Dennis left Akintunde with the ball at his feet, again his shot was blocked and fell back to **Sam Edwards**, his first effort was also blocked but it fell back to him and with a clear sight of the bottom left corner he placed it there with aplomb leaving Adu-Poku motionless as his shot from the edge of the box gave Barking the lead again.

Barking managed to avoid conceding quickly and even had a few chances of their own with Stacey curling his effort just wide of the goal but Newham always looked dangerous on the counter and they found themselves level again with twelve minutes remaining as they split Barking open down the middle, Pedro once more finding himself through on goal, this time shooting low and hard past Purdue into the net. The succession of quick goals somehow continued as Barking regained the lead, substitute Tony Martin finding himself in space on the right wing and his perfect cross found **Teddy Stacey** in the box who stooped low to flick the ball on with his head, past Adu-Poku and into the bottom left corner of the net for 4-3.

Newham to their credit never gave up and they continued to look dangerous. Their best chance coming in injury time as again a striker found himself one-on-one with Purdue, this time as he attempted to round him Dan did well to stick out a leg and deflect the ball into his body before gratefully smothering it to ensure Barking took all three points, getting them ever closer to the playoffs.

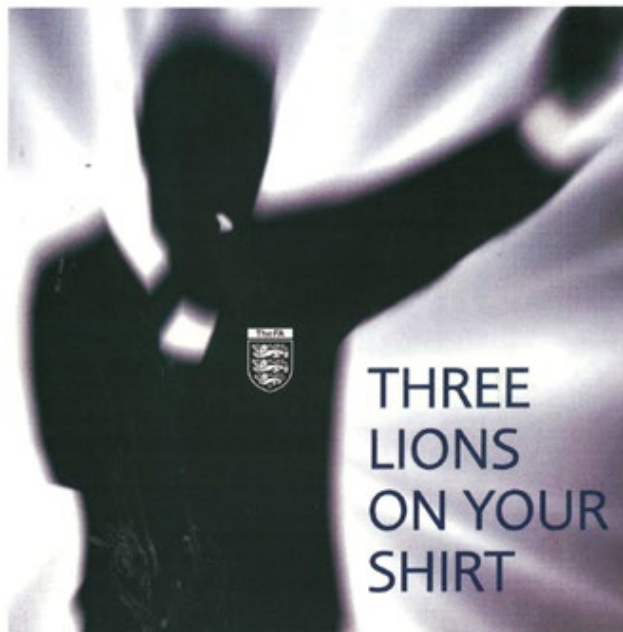

STANSTED

Records show that the club goes back as far as 1902 and although success has mainly been confined to the League and Cups, our club name still stands proudly in the FA Handbook as winners of the FA Vase when in the 1983-84 season the players and fans made the trip to Wembley and in front of a crowd of 8,500 beat Stamford 3-2, a memorable occasion where the memories of a great day are portrayed in the Club Committee Room.

There was however a period of dark days when in 2012-13 the future of the club looked bleak where lack of leadership at the helm of the club led to a situation whereby outstanding debts meant there could have been a distinct possibility of the club folding. However a new committee of fresh faces was found and under the stewardship of Glyn Warwick the club managed to see off the threats of the bailiffs knocking at the club door. The new motivated Committee members were able to put plans in place, and over several years has attracted both new sponsors and supporters to the club, thus ensuring a brighter future.

At the end of 2018 – 19 season many Stansted followers (The Airport Army) were reflecting on what had been the most successful club season we have had for many years. To be able to display not just one trophy, but three because as well as collecting the League cup and the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy we also received the Shield for our Second-place finish in the League. The club were not considered by many to be in contention for any honours after the experience of the previous season when the club won a late reprieve from the FA and avoided relegation to step 6 status. That made the success even more remarkable and was great testament to the hard work put in by the whole coaching staff and players.

With the Essex Senior League now in its 55th season of competition we are proud to still be able to promote the club as being one of the Leagues founder members, although prior to the success of 2018 - 19 season our only other honours were a League Title in 2009-10 and two League Challenge Cup wins in 1983-84 & 2010-11, therefore the club are now hoping to build on these latest achievements.

Of course last season (its 54th) we missed out having been laterally moved by the FA to compete in the Spartan South Midlands League. Despite appealing what we felt was a truly ridiculous decision based solely on the geographical position of the club and not taking into account the severe financial constraints it would have on us the FA hierarchy stood by their decision and we kicked off the 2023-24 season away at Biggleswade United. Losing experienced players who were unhappy with the move proved a testing time with our goal being to try and be as competitive as we could and retain our Step 5 status, this to the credit of the team management and the players they successfully fulfilled finishing the season comfortably in a mid-table position.

The overwhelming decision by all on the club committee was to apply to the FA to be placed back in the ESL for the 2024-25 season, and at last they saw sense and so we now kick off a new season competing against those teams we've had many battles against over the years.

Away from the first team the clubs Over 45's are still going strong and look forward to another campaign competing in the Essex Veterans League.

And the clubs Youth section continues to grow with this season teams at Under 8, 9, 14, 15, 16, & 18. This we believe is providing opportunities to develop players to have Stansted FC in their blood and a desire to play for the club at any level.

WEST ESSEX 1-0 BARKING FC

Friday 21 March 2025 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

At the start of the Non-League Day weekend Barking's impressive form came to a shuddering halt as they were outplayed by West Essex, falling victim to conceding yet another penalty with the hosts also having a goal ruled out for offside.

It was not a game high on quality and it took to the half hour for any chance of note as Barking had muted appeals for a penalty turned down as Akilijo Balliu attempted to get in front of goalkeeper Lewis Edwards dealing with a bobbly back pass. West Essex went the closer of the two sides five minutes later as Barking were not awake to a quick free kick, leading to a powerful cross which was nodded wide from close range.

The second half was much of the same, Barking devoid of any fluidity with West Essex edging the game without actually testing Dan Purdue. West Essex did actually have the ball into net after 55 minutes through Nathan Braithwaite after another long free kick but although initially a goal was given, it was eventually ruled out for offside for Yemi Adelani impeding Purdue. Barking did eventually come into the game with some half chances including Caleb Dennis and Balliu shooting from outside of the box but clearing the bar. In reality if there was going to be a winner it was to be West Essex, as nine minutes from time the Blues gifted them the opportunity as Zak Oliver was bundled over in the box by a combination of Calab Dennis and Lorenzo Saponara, marking the fourth consecutive competitive game in which Barking had conceded a penalty. Dan Purdue did guess the right way, but Jaedon Phillips penalty bobbled over his outstretched hand and into the net.

Despite the deficit, Barking couldn't mount any meaningful pressure as the home side saw out the final ten minutes, the only chance being a Tony Martin free kick from inside the D of the box which comfortably cleared the crossbar.

BARKING FC 3-2 SAWBRIDGEWORTH TOWN

Saturday 15 March 2025 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking somehow staged an unlikely comeback to take all three points after an undercooked performance against Sawbridgeworth Town. Sawbo had a 2-0 lead at half time before goals in the final twenty minutes from Akilijo Balliu, Juwon Akintunde and a first for Michele Maccari in injury time secured a vital three points for Barking.

Sawbridgeworth were comfortably the better team in the first half and Barking had a warning of what was to come after two minutes as Joshua Fox volleyed over unmarked from a free kick. A Sawbo striker blazed over from the edge of the box after the half hour mark with Barking not at the races and they were eventually punished two minutes later as a Caleb Dennis pass to Sam Shaban was intercepted in the centre circle and the visiting player found Elijah Grant in space on the edge of the box, his powerful effort flew past Dan Purdue and into the net.

Sawbridgeworth doubled their lead just minutes later, Charlie Thomson conceding a penalty after bundling over Morgan Arnold just on the line of the box. Grant stepped up and sent Purdue the wrong way as the ball nestled perfectly in the bottom left corner of the net.

The second goal finally injected some life into Barking and they had a number of half chances before the end of the first half, culminating in the best chance of them all as Sawbridgeworth's goalkeeper Jimmy Parker failed to clear a free kick, the ball eventually fell to Sam Shaban but he was off balance on the edge of the six yard box and his effort easily cleared the bar.

Barking got a rollicking and a series of substitutions at half time: Fionn Murphy, Lorenzo Saponara and Michele Maccari replacing Tyrese Sibanda, Sam Shaban and Scott Doe. Barking did come out of the blocks with renewed impetus as Sam Edwards and Murphy forcing Parker into saves he was expected to make but from thereon the game went quiet until the 72nd minute when **Akiljo Balliu** halved the deficit as he snuck in between goalkeeper and defender before prodding the ball from a difficult angle.

Barking started to believe and they were level eleven minutes later, pressure leading to a cross from Edwards and this found **Juwon Akintunde** in the box who turned and shot impeccably, his low drive went straight into the bottom left corner of the net giving Parker no chance, for number 26 of his season.

The Barking pressure continued and they delivered the ultimate blow in injury time, **Michele Maccari** finding himself in space on the edge of the box near the left wing and his side footed curling effort taking a deflection that left Parker flat footed as the ball hit the frame of the goal once it was over the line.

The persistent Sawbridgeworth time wasting throughout the game meant there was a hefty period of added time but Barking saw it out comfortably and they took away three points from a situation where that at times never looked possible.

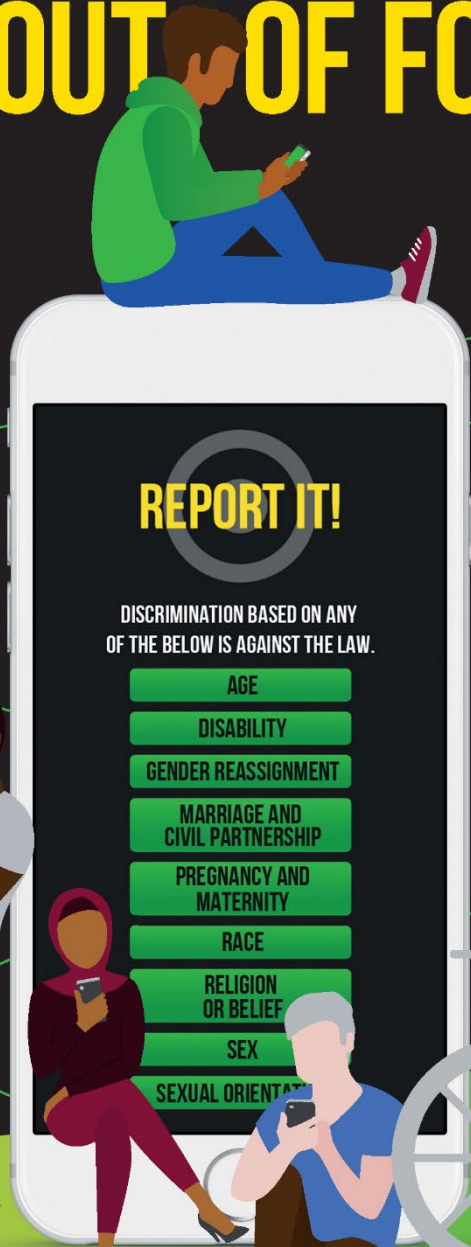
