BARKING 0-2 TILBURY

Tuesday 8 August 2023 – Essex Senior League – Report by Terry Gilbert

The match marked the club's first meeting since last April, when Charlie MacDonald's penalty secured a narrow win for Barking but failed to gain a relegation playoff match. This time around, it was the Dockers who reigned supreme, capitalising on their constant pressure and making a splash as torrential rain drenched the second half.

There were five former Barking players who had switched allegiances to Tilbury: Jack Folan, Jack Hayes, Alfie Leach, Johnny Ashman, and Tom Salter. It was, however, the latter two who found the back of the net to seal Tilbury's victory.

The game burst into life from the opening whistle, with Tilbury showing their intent to dominate proceedings. Early on though, Fahad Nynja managed to wrest control of the ball, launching a rapid counterattack that culminated in a promising shot from Kai Haysman. But, Tilbury's goalkeeper, Anthony Page, thwarted the attempt with a well-timed smother. Tilbury's attacking prowess continued to put pressure on Barking's defence, resulting in several close calls. In the 17th minute, Tilbury celebrated a goal, only for the assistant's flag to halt their celebrations due to an offside infringement. Two minutes later, a foul committed by Tom Troubridge presented Tilbury with a centrally placed free-kick opportunity. Johnny Ashman stepped up to take the set piece, but Harry Girling in the Barking goal was equal to the effort parrying the ball away. As the first half progressed, Barking managed to establish a foothold in the match: Chris Adu-Gyamfi navigated his way to the byline before delivering a pinpoint cross to Haysman, whose subsequent shot was once again denied by Page. On 26 Ashman breaks away for Tilbury and passes across the box but the subsequent shot is blocked for a corner, seven minutes from the break Haysman passes across field to Martin Tuohy who flicks the ball on to Brad Rowland who shoots but his effort is wide. After five minutes of added time Nyanja again wins the ball and frees Adu-Gyamfi but his first time shot flies over. In the end the away side looked the more dangerous but Barking playing on the counter found this provided their best opportunities.

After the break Barking forced some early corners and free kicks that came to nothing as they tried to start on the front foot. Tilbury began to intensify their efforts, constantly pressing forward and on 57 only a last-gasp clearance from Aundre Spencer at the expense of a corner stopped a clear effort on goal.. In the 65th minute, Tilbury should have broken the deadlock when Ashman squandered a golden chance, firing over from a promising position. Moments later, Tom Salter unleashed a shot that soared above the crossbar. Tilbury's relentless assault eventually bore fruit in the 70th minute:. Salter opened the scoring by curling the ball beyond Girling's reach and the Dockers' lead was further solidified six minutes later, courtesy of Ashman's clinical finish from Brian Moses pass. As the match entered its dying embers, Barking mounted an effort to salvage a consolation goal. A run by Brad Rowland set up a chance for David Owiredo to deliver a cross to Adu-Gyamfi. Unfortunately for Barking, the execution fell just short, and Page collected the ball to preserve his and Tilbury's clean sheet.

After the final whistle Barking were left to reflect on the match and need to regroup for the challenges that lie ahead – the next challenge being on Saturday at the Lawtech Stadium against Stanway Rovers.

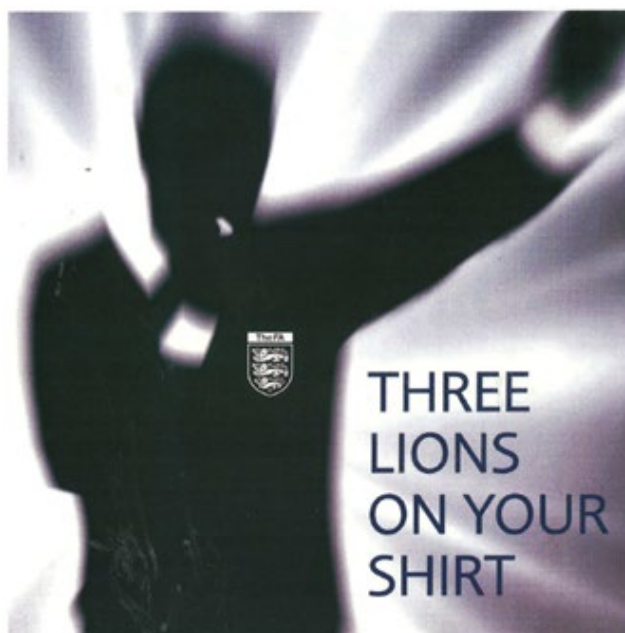

BARKING FC 5-1 STANWAY ROVERS

Saturday 26 November 2022 – Essex Senior League – Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking kept up their impressive return to form with a convincing 5-1 victory over Stanway Rovers, thanks in no small part to a hat-trick from Charlie Heatley. The other goals came from Ahmed Abdulla and Georgie Fairhead.

This was also our first home victory over Rovers since November 1999 when we beat them 2-1 in a FA Vase second round replay with goals from John O'Sullivan and Jon Buffong.



Heatley's hat-trick was not only the first of the season but also the first in the league since Petrit Elbi on April 8th 2017, the day we won the Essex Senior League title at Burnham Ramblers. Stanway started the more dangerous of the two sides and had a deserved lead after 14 minutes and it was a deja vu from the fixture earlier in the season as a long throw was flicked on towards goal by Stanway's William Crissell and Dev Bhamra was unable to stop the ball from the going over the line. A tetchy game escalated quickly at the half hour mark as after fouling Alessandro Wisdom the Stanway scorer Crissell was sent off for kicking out at Wisdom, this led to a small melee with Alfie Leach also given his marching orders leaving both sides with ten men. Barking got back into the game immediately as from the free kick resulting from the foul Ergis Kastrati nodded the ball back across goal and **Charlie Heatley** was there to power the ball home for Barking's equaliser.

Bhamra was equal to a long shot after 38 minutes and then in first half injury time Barking nabbed the lead that was probably not deserved on balance as Jess Norey's through ball was originally missed by Heatley, but as the defender focused on him **Ahmed Abdulla** slipped past him to drive the ball across Stanway keeper Alfie Marigiliani and into the net.

Barking doubled their lead after 54 minutes as **Charlie Heatley** latched onto Jack Folan's dinked through ball and despite the narrow angle he drove the ball low across the goalkeeper into the side of the net to make it 3-1 to the Blues and leaving Stanway appealing in vain for offside.

Abdulla flashed an effort from the edge of the box just over the bar after good work by Alessandro Wisdom as the Blues looked to further extend their lead. Despite losing Leach, Barking's several makeshift defences stood firm, firstly Kyrell Palmer partnering Ergis Kastrati in defence, before Kyrell himself was forced off with injury, meaning a first league appearance for Harrison Abu who put an impressive shift dealing with aerial attacks and Kastrati who had three different centre back partners during the match. The Blues stood firm and added two goals late on – **Charlie Heatley** securing the match ball after 88 minutes as he volleyed home from Ahmed Abdulla's free kick.

The second saw the Blues playing the ball seamlessly around the pitch, with at least 20 passes before finding substitute **Georgie Fairhead** who cut in from the left side of the box and powered the ball into the net to put Barking 5-1 ahead in injury time. In-between those two goals there was still a good chance for substitute Sam Shaban as he worked hard to latch onto a long ball but his turn and shot was just wide of the goal.

STANWAY ROVERS

The modern club was established on 10th July 1956, although records show that another club by the same name had been playing in the early 1900s, including winning Division II B of the Essex & Suffolk Border League in 1927-28. The new club joined Division Two of the Colchester and East Essex League, and by 1960 had reached the Premier Division. They won the Premier Division in 1967-68 and again in 1973-74. The following season saw them reach the final of the Essex Junior Cup, where they lost 1-0 to Takeley.

In 1975, Stanway joined Division One of the Essex & Suffolk Border League and, in 1978, were placed in the new Division Two. The 1978-79 season saw the club finish third and win promotion to Division One. They were later relegated to Division Two, which they won in 1981-82 and again in 1985-86 after another relegation. However, in 1986-87 the club won Division One and were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1990 and 1991 the club reached the final of the Essex Intermediate Cup but lost both matches 3-1. In 1991-92, they were Premier Division runners-up and were promoted to Division One of the Eastern Counties League. In 2005-06 the club won Division One and were promoted to the Premier Division. They went on to win the League Cup in 2008-09, beating Leiston 4-2 on penalties in the final. They won the cup again in 2011-12 with a 2-1 win over Norwich United in the final.

At the end of the 2017-18 season, Stanway were transferred to the Essex Senior League. However, after a single season in the Essex Senior League, they were moved back to the Eastern Counties League Premier Division.

The club was initially based at the King George V playing fields in Lexden (more commonly known as Clairmont Road) before moving to The Stanway School in 1961. In 1979 the club agreed a 99-year lease with the local council for a 4.6-acre (19,000 m²) plot of land. On 18th November 1982 the new clubhouse was opened and named The Hawthorns.

ON THIS DAY: BARKING 2-3 WALTHAM ABBEY

Saturday 12 August 2017 – Isthmian League North

Barking fell to a 3-2 defeat in their first game back in the Bostik North at the hands of Waltham Abbey. Billy Holland put Abbey in front before an equaliser by Ben O'Brien but second half goals from Darrelle Russell and Christian Assombalonga put the result away from the Blues before a late penalty from Billy Jones created some nerves.

Abbey saw an early volley clear the bar but Lewis Lockyer was the first goalkeeper called into action as he palmed away a free kick from Abs Seymour after Michael Pindy had been fouled. Bowles was forced into action for the first time after 9 minutes with a routine save but a minute later Barking were a goal down as an Abbey attacker drove down the left wing and powered the ball across goal – Bowles was on hand to palm it away but it fell to Billy Holland who volleyed towards goal where it took a wicked deflection wrongfooting the Barking stopper and giving Waltham Abbey the lead. Barking were level 6 minutes later however – a corner by Abs Seymour to the far post was met by the leaping Ben O'Brien who headed back across goal – an Abbey defender stretched to try and hook the ball away but the ball has crossed the line and the goal was given. The game slowed down with only one other chance of note for either team – just before the half hour mark Seymour chipped a ball over the top of the Abbey defence to find Billy Jones but his volleyed attempt was blocked away. There was a first chance of the game for Waltham Abbey's Christian Assombalonga but he headed wide from a corner.

Assombalonga started the second half with another chance from a lobbed through ball but he was crowded out and the chance missed. The Waltham Abbey pressure continued and with half an hour left on the clock came close to taking the lead again as a low cross from the right fizzed across goal with Barking relieved to see Ricky Tarbard knocking the ball out for a corner. Abbey continued to have the majority of possession with Barking being equal to the attacks but unable to retain the ball higher up the field.

The pressure finally told after 75 minutes as a scuffed ball from the left wing found Darrell Russell who held off a Barking defender placing the ball in the bottom right corner of the net. Goldy Capela was introduced immediately and came close to scoring quickly but was denied by Lockyer making a comfortable save. Left-back Will Putt was taken off and replaced by striker Dan Gilchrist with the Blues moving to a back 3 with Ricky Tarbard moving to centre-back. The move left gaps however and Christian Assombalonga latched onto a long ball before twisting and turning away from Danny Fitzsimons and smashing the ball home with an emphatic finish to make the score 3-1 with only 5 minutes remaining.

Barking did halve the deficit and make for an interesting few minutes as Goldy Capela continued his impressive cameo and won a penalty after being tripped in the box. Billy Jones stepped up to take the penalty and Lockyer the wrong way as he dived to his right and the ball went to his left for Jones first goal in a Barking shirt. The Blues rushed forward in the remaining minutes with goalkeeper Ollie Bowles pushing forward in the last few set pieces but they were unable to grab an equalising goal.

ON THIS DAY: WALTHAM FOREST 0-5 BARKING FC

August 12 2015 – Essex Senior League

Barking recovered from a disappointing Saturday as they eased past Waltham Forest with a 5-0 victory at Wadham Lodge. First half goals by Eden Nelson and Tobi Adesina were added to in the second half by Luke Foster, Sipho Mtyanda and Ben Turner. With only two league games gone Barking now turn their attention to the FA Cup as they travel to Felixstowe & Walton in the Extra Preliminary Round on Saturday.

The Blues (playing in yellow) nearly took the lead in the first minute but Sipho Mtyanda's curling attempt after cutting in from the left wing was well held by Forest's goalkeeper. Shortly after, playing together for the first time in a competitive game, Eden Nelson slipped through Tobi Adesina on goal but his attempt was blocked by the advancing Forest goalkeeper. With 5 minutes gone, Barking did beat the goalkeeper, as Adesina squared the ball across goal to Nelson but his attempt was blocked on the line by a home team defender. Forest had their chance at the 15-minute mark but Jason Willis was on hand to save comfortably at a narrow angle. 2 minutes later and Barking found themselves ahead, Mtyanda received the ball and advanced down the right wing where he launched a powerful high cross into the box where it dipped and found the head of the onrushing Nelson who headed past the goalkeeper's left side and into the net. Barking should have doubled their lead with 20 minutes gone as Adesina was able to nick the ball past the goalkeeper who promptly tripped him, who was cautioned for his indiscretion. Joe Staunton stepped up but his penalty lacked power and was too close to the keeper who was able to palm it away. Barking's resultant corner was cleared away for a Forest counterattack but the returning Bradley Ling managed to usher the ball back to Willis. Willis cleared the ball up the field where it found Eden Nelson who flicked the ball to Luke Foster who found himself free of defenders advancing on the goalkeeper. Unselfishly, he passed the ball across to Adesina who wrong footed the goalkeeper and slid the ball low into the bottom left corner of the net. Adesina nearly had his second 5 minutes later as he latched onto a route 1 ball by Glen Golby but he could only knee the bouncing ball wide. The pace slowed but Nelson nearly scored with 10 minutes of the first half remaining as he latched onto a poor defensive header but his chipped attempt was over the bar. With 38 minutes gone Adesina again found himself on goal thanks to a route 1 ball, this time by Willis but his sidefooted attempt was saved by the goalkeeper. Dogged Forest defending again prevented Barking from scoring just before half time as Nelson's powerful cross across the box found Mtyanda who after getting the ball under the control shot past the goalkeeper but again the shot was blocked off the line by the defender.

Waltham Forest started the second half stronger but it was Barking who would score next. With 10 minutes gone, Mtyanda set Luke Foster down the left wing who saw the goalkeeper had tried to read the cross by coming off his line, so hit a cross/shot towards the goal, which left the goalkeeper helpless and it went over his head and into the right side of the net. 4 minutes later and Adesina had a good chance but his attempt to slide the ball through the goalkeeper's legs was blocked. With 30 minutes to go, Barking took their foot off the pedal and the best chances came for Forest, firstly Willis comfortably collected a low shot before a Forest striker found himself free on goal against Willis but from a wide angle his shot blazed wide. With the game coming to a close, Barking found themselves attacking again, this time Mtyanda turned from provider to scorer, as he jinked past 3 defenders outside the box and once he was inside the box sidefooted the ball powerfully into the roof of the net to give the Yellows a four-goal lead. Waltham Forest did not give up attacking and Willis was again on hand to deny them from a narrow angle using a combination of feet and hands before Billy Rix cleared the ball from danger. Barking did eventually get their fifth, as two substitutes combined from a Ben O'Brien short corner. O'Brien passed to Billy Reynolds, who from the right corner of the box put in a high in-swinging cross where he met the head of Ben Turner who jumped highest to nod the ball past the 'keeper and into the net. The final whistle blew shortly after the restart as Barking got their first win of the season and a performance they hope to carry on to a tough FA Cup tie at Felixstowe & Walton.
