BARKING 0-3 TAKELEY

FA Vase Second Qualifying Round - Saturday 21 September - Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking were comfortably beaten for the second time this season by Takeley, knocking the Blues out of the FA Vase in the process. Takeley were well worth their 3-0 victory on a frustrating afternoon at the Lawtech Stadium for the home team.

There were two new players in the starting eleven: Panny Boxer and Alvin Kyeremeh plus a third debut from the bench for Andre Anderson

The first chance did fall to Barking with six minutes gone as Hassan Nalbant found himself in the D of the box with a pressuring defender for company but his low effort was straight at keeper Jarvis Monk. Takeley then took the lead after ten minutes, probably slightly against the run of the play as Jack Mitchell unleashed a thunderbolt into the top right corner of the net from about 30 yards. Barking's vulnerable defensive line was exposed again after 23 minutes as the visitors doubled their lead, Takeley won the ball back at the halfway line thanks to a crunching (but very fair) tackle from Thomas Massey and the ball was threaded down the left for Jordan Wescott who cut the ball back for Mitchell in the box who powerfully side footed the ball back across Max Spence and into the net, to score his and Takeley's second. Marcel McDonald went close for the Blues moments later after Sam Shaban drove forward but his effort from the edge of the box was into the side netting. Barking didn't learn their lesson and were nearly punished again as Takeley cut through the Barking backline but they had Spence in goal to thank as he saved the effort with his feet.

Barking started slightly brighter in the second half including a long-range effort from Miles Smith that just passed over the bar but it counted for nothing as the defensive line was cut open again after 58 minutes when Lanre Balogun was gifted the freedom of the Barking half to take the ball around Spence and slot into an empty net. Barking struggled to get close to breaking down a resolute Takeley defence and in reality struggled to keep the ball at all. It took 25 minutes for any other chance of note and it fell unsurprisingly to Takeley as an effort smacked the bar with the rebound being headed over. Barking did have some late efforts: Jalen Johnson seeing an effort saved by Monk when he really should have squared it.

Miles Smith saw his cross/shot whistle past the post and in injury time Juwon Akintunde saw his effort clawed away from goal by Monk but in reality it was a fair scoreline which sees Takeley progress to the First-Round proper of the FA Vase and Barking to rue on two FA competition defeats in a week.

BARKING 1-0 WEST ESSEX

Friday 6 September 2024 - Essex Senior League - Report by Trevor Gilbert

Barking continued with the good times after their FA Cup success in midweek with an important three points in a 1-0 victory against West Essex in only our fourth league fixture of the season. Sam Edwards scored the vital goal with substitute Nelly Martins seeing red late on.

West Essex were keen to sit deep and punish Barking on the counter, the tactic nearly worked after nine minutes as Teddy Stacey lost the ball in the middle – the ball was spread out wide to Yemi Adelani and he drove into the box but his shot from a narrow angle was well saved by Max Spence. Spence was again called into action after 21 minutes as he palmed away a free kick that threatened to break the deadlock. It was deja vu for that situation but with the roles reversed after 30 minutes, Hassan Nalbant was fouled on the edge of the box and Sam Edwards stepped up and curled his effort around the wall and again it looked to be a goal before the outstretched hand of his namesake Lewis Edwards clawed the ball away from the goal. Nalbant went close just before half time as he latched on to a defence splitting lofted ball from Marcel McDonald but his side footed effort cleared the bar at the near post.

Barking threatened again right at the start of the second half. Andy Greenslade played Jay Bacon into the box and his lifted ball to the far post was met by Jerrold Cobblah who poked the ball towards goal but it was just too close to the feet of Edwards who managed to stop the ball from going past him. There was no time to stop however as West Essex pushed forward and they made an effort that went just wide of the post. Barking grew more comfortable into the game and were rewarded for a period of pressure with 21 minutes to go: Jay Bacon's corner was met at the near post by Stacey – his header down found **Sam Edwards** on the edge of the six-yard box and he managed to power the ball home on the stretch to give Barking the lead.

Nalbant then went close twice immediately after as he attempted to double the lead, first he saw his curled effort blocked over the bar before he headed wide from the subsequent corner. Barking constantly looked the team more likely to score and there was another chance after 85 minutes as substitute Juwon Akintunde passed the ball over the defence – Nalbant went through on goal but Lewis Edwards did well to come out quickly to smother the ball – the rebound fell to Marcel McDonald but his effort was too close to Edwards. For the second game in a row Barking received a late red card as this time substitute Nelly Mallek was sent off for his role in a foul he conceded and the ensuing handbags. It was still Barking who went closest in the final moments as Nalbant was through on goal and attempted to round Lewis Edwards but he was pushed wide and the goalkeeper managed to deny him with his feet just before the final whistle.

WEST ESSEX

West Essex FC are based in Highams Park, East London. We provide affordable sporting activity for everyone in the local community. At the time of writing, we run semi-professional and development sides in the Essex Senior League, an U18 side in the Southern Counties Floodlit League, 19 boy's teams, 5 girls only teams, a Kickers Soccer School and our SSE Wildcats activities. Our club coaches are also active in the LBWF wider schools' community, providing football activities in schools across the borough in the Easter and Summer Holiday Activity Programme. Our playing membership across all these sections of the club stands at circa 450.

The brainchild of former West Essex Cricket Club stalwarts John Spinks and Richard Saunders, West Essex FC formed in 1989.

After 4 seasons of considerable success in the Ilford & District League, an 'A' team was added for the 1993-94 season and the 1st & Reserve teams moved to the Essex Business Houses League.

In 2007-08, the 1st XI effectively folded, and the club ran one senior side which finished rock-bottom of the EBHFL Division 1. Towards the end of that season, Gary Lefley became involved with the side. Gary forged a strong partnership with existing player/manager Dan Reading and their first full season together proved to be a very successful one as an extraordinary turnaround in fortunes saw West Essex lift the EBHFL Division 1 title in 2008-09.

With success came an influx of new players and we were fortunate enough to reinstate the Reserve team who, under the guidance of Wesley Sotherton, won a trophy in their first season. The resulting celebrations culminated in them losing the trophy, but that's a story for another day.

At the end of the 2009-10 season, the management took the decision to withdraw the 1st XI from the Essex Business Houses League and move them to the Middlesex County Football League. The season that followed will live long in the memory as, in May 2011, it culminated with another trophy being added to the cabinet as West Essex were crowned champions of the MCFL Division 1 Central & East.

Promoted as Champions, in August 2011 West Essex had their first taste of Step 7 Football. Despite the season being blighted by injuries and suspensions, they finished it stationed safely in mid-table and took a few memorable scalps along the way. Further progress was made in 2012/13 as West Essex consolidated their MCFL Premier Division status with another mid-table finish, but with more points and a better record in all departments. Towards the end of the season new coach Kwame Kwateng joined with a view to adding some style to our obvious substance. 2013/14 was a memorable season for the club. Injuries, poor form and some appalling luck saw us staring down the barrel of relegation at the turn of the year. A fantastic run of form saw us finish the season sitting comfortably in mid-table and emerging victorious in the Alec Smith Premier Division Cup final. In 2014/15, we continued to make progress by attaining our highest ever MCFL Premier Division finish of 6th. We also gained more points, scored more goals and conceded less than in any previous season. In 2015/16, with our ground-share agreement in place at Barking FC, we took the decision to apply for promotion from the MCFL. We didn't lose a game from August 8th until January 2nd which included a run of 11 straight wins. But we couldn't shake off our fellow title chasers and promotion candidates. Our second appearance in 3 years in the Alec Smith Cup Final, you might argue, was an unwanted distraction. We lost the Alec Smith Final on pens having been 2 nil up with less than 30 mins to go. On the coach back from the final, devastated as we were, a chorus of "WE'RE GONNA WIN THE LEAGUE!!" broke out. 14 days later, that is exactly what we did. After losing to New Hanford on April 9th, we took 23 of the 27 points available to take the title from under LPOSSA's noses and were crowned champions of the MCFL Premier Division. In doing so, we guaranteed promotion to the Essex Senior League and a taste of semi-professional football for the first time in our short history.

WEST ESSEX

The summer of 2020 West Essex FC combined the senior and junior sections as a new 'through' club that gives us a structured pathway for children aged from 4 years, all the way through to our Senior 1st XI and covers all related areas of community football. Perhaps as important, is the bringing together of the key committee members of junior and senior football into one new and expanded club committee. This gives us the opportunity to leverage a vast skillset of our fully committed team, all of whom have incredible experience, knowledge and understanding of grassroots football. Mark Penfold, previously Chairman and founder of our junior football operation, now assumes the position of West Essex FC Chairman.

In April 2023 after an extraordinary stint of 10 years at the helm, the committee took the incredibly difficult and emotional decision to relieve Kwame of his duties and appointed his long-time assistant George Karsa as manager. George has tremendous pedigree, a strong network and compliments his excellent work ethic with a highly progressive footballing philosophy. We are united in our belief that George is the right man to drive the club forward on the next leg of our journey up the non-league pyramid.

BARKING FC 6-3 REDBRIDGE FC

London Senior Cup First Round - September 24 2019 - Report by Terry Gilbert

The opening period was rushed and with not much direction as the game settled into a pattern with the only real effort of note was a shot from Sheri Artmeladze which just cleared the bar. Barking went in front on ten minutes when good work by Artmeladze freed Michael Dixon who despite being wide of the goal managed to beat Martin George in the Redbridge goal. Four minutes later a Jack Roult cross finds a well-placed Nana Boakye-Yiadom but his header was wide of the goal. After scoring and despite pushing forward Barking were unable to find any real cutting edge, but on 27 minutes Boakye-Yiadom battled through under pressure and prodded the ball goal wards but Reece Latimer made a last-ditch clearance and not all of the ball had crossed the line. It took another 24 minutes for the home side to score their second when the ball was moved around nicely and Boakye-Yiadom's cross was smartly finished at the far post by Junior Dadson for his first Barking goal. With just a minute to the interval Redbridge were back in it and from a Barking point of view it was a sloppy goal to give away. From our own corner the ball was cleared and facing his own Donnell Anderson played a poor pass meant for Jordan Peart but was not near him and it freed Dan Gilchrist and with Montel Joseph rushing from his goal to close the space, Gilchrist as we know can finish and he did from distance to reduce the arrears. The two-goal cushion was regained in the 45 minutes as a again good approach play ended with Dixon turning provider and Jack Roult nudged in the cross from close range for his first senior goal.

It took just two minutes into the second half when Jack Roult went from saint to sinner as he committed a poor challenge to give Redbridge a penalty. Gilchrist stepped up to take it and although Joseph saved the initial effort, Gilchrist was first to the rebound and reduced the arrears to a single goal. Just after the hour Dixon came close to scoring when receiving a short throw in, he shielded the ball, turned and fired in a low shot which George did well to turn away for a corner. On 63 after receiving the ball in his own half Junior Dadson went on a powerful run which ended with a shot which flashed just wide of the goal, four minutes later Barking restored the two-goal cushion when a cross field from Abs Seymour found Sheri Artmeladze who closed in on goal and planted a powerful shot into the net for 4-2. A clever flick by Dixon set sub Kojo Apenteng free into the area but he could not keep his shot down. Just when things seemed to be moving along nicely up popped Dan Gilchrist to complete his hat trick; again, Joseph saved the first shot but the Redbridge striker was first and there was just a single goal between the teams. With thirteen minutes Barking were two goals in front again - Michael Dixon received the ball from a throw-in, moved cleverly across the penalty area and then delivered a quality finish into the far corner of the net for an excellent example of centre forward play. Redbridge tried to come again and a cross flashed across our goal with thankfully no in a red shirt able to finish. With nine minutes left and after a spell of "pinball football" Dadson found himself in a promising position, but although he got his shot away and was on target George in the visiting goal was able to hold onto the ball. Four minutes from time and the game was up for Redbridge when from their corner Seymour played Michael Dixon in on goal and despite having a distance to run with the ball and being alert enough to look around for friend or foe he took the ball around George and fired home for a hat trick in only his second game for us.
